SIXTH SUNDAY of EASTER



All you need is love! *A* (*wildly*) *popular band sang that over fifty years ago. If you can remember back then, it seems nothing has changed, unless it has gotten worse. So, is the word love merely an illusion about which some still sing?*

FIRST READING Acts 10:44-48

They are not like us! We seem to have this sense that some things are "ok" and other things are not. It is easiest to make that distinction by looking at other people. We then determine (judge?) which of them is good – like me. And, which are not! We continue our reading in the book of Acts, which tells how the earliest Christ-followers acted on his command to go out to all the world. Chapter 10 describes a pivotal encounter. Enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they – and we – start to see the real implications of for God so loved the world...

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. ⁴⁵The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, ⁴⁶for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

SECOND READING 1 John 5:1-6

Now an old man, the apostle is reflecting on the profound and difficult assertion, that God came in human flesh – and died. He also realizes God was acting in resurrection power. So now, then, how is this to affect us? Will we let this love God is giving us lead to love for others – all others? Water and blood, verse 6, refers to John 19:33-34, where the soldier pierces Jesus' side to see if he really is dead. Some suggest this verse points to the Sacraments – water for Baptism and the blood of Holy Communion. Above all, this emphasizes the reality of God's work to save the world.

Leveryone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ²By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

⁶This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 15:9-17

We are listening in as Jesus speaks to his disciples the evening before his death. They did not understand what was about to unfold. We cannot fully grasp all that the God-whom-Jesus-called-Father was doing to show love. Yet we are called to let our hearts be transformed by this love so we can live out the Great Commandment – Mark 12:28-31 – and show God's love for the whole world.

And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."







"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. **Acts 10:47-48a (NRSV)**

A Prayer for the Week:

Gracious God, just as the Holy Spirit surprised Peter and his friends by including Gentiles in the church, open our hearts and minds to new ways to accept and love others. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

God at our table, giver of bread, bless us to love, just as you've said. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the God who has done marvelous things, bless you with joy and God's steadfast love and faithfulness. (Psalm 98)

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Tell of a story when you were greatly surprised by something.
- Talk about an event that changed or influenced your life.
- The church's identity changed to include Gentiles for the first time (Acts 10:44-48). How has your understanding of the church grown over the years to be more inclusive?

Read: John 15:9-17.

Jesus' command to love one another describes the life of his followers, people who were chosen by Jesus to be his disciples and enabled to bear fruit (v. 16). That opens up the lives of Jesus' followers to love and befriend others. Similarly, in Acts 10:44-48 the Holy Spirit amazed Peter and his fellow disciples and expanded their vision to include the uncircumcised to be accepted as part of the church. God's ways surprise and empower us through the word of God and the Spirit of God. Reflect on how God's word (Jesus' commandment to love) and the Holy Spirit have opened your life to love others and see the call to discipleship in ways that connect you to a larger world of care. Conclude by praying:

Pray: Dear God, thank you for choosing me and all whom you call friends. Grant me and all believers your power to bear fruit and to love and accept others for Jesus' sake and in his name. Amen.

Cornelius welcomed Peter and others into his home. It was in the home that Cornelius received Peter's message and where his household was baptized. Peter and his friends were asked to stay in Cornelius' home for several days, obviously giving the new converts more time and experience with the message of Jesus. In the New Testament the home is church, too. Invite others to your home and use portions of this *Taking Faith Home* bulletin to share God's word and empower lives in the Christian faith.

Throughout the Bible and the history of the church, singing has been a faithful way of worshipping God and expressing one's faith in God (Psalm 98). Sing and/or pray the words of *Spirit of the Living God* and add other songs as well. Begin your singing and praying by saying the worlds of Psalm 98:4: **Make a joyful noise to the LORD**, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.
