James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor with more honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? Or was he speaking out of his human worldview, but transcended those limits when she took him by surprise with her reply? Either way, the story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings her or his need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

SECOND READING

James 2:1-17

Faithful Christians do not show partiality to the rich and powerful of the world, especially at the expense of the poor and weak. Likewise, faith does not pay mere lip-service to God's will. Instead, a living Christian faith expresses itself in acts of compassion and mercy for those in need.

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? ²For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, ³and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, *"Have a seat here, please,"* while to the one who is poor you say, *"Stand there,"* or, *"Sit at my feet,"* ⁴have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? ⁵Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? ⁶But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? ⁷Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? ⁸You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture,

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."⁹But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. ¹¹For the one who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. ¹²So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. ¹³For judgment will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment. ¹⁴What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? ¹⁵If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, ¹⁶and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? ¹⁷So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

In Mark's gospel, encounters with women usually signify turning points in Jesus' ministry. Here, a conversation with a Syrophoenician woman marks the beginning of his mission to the Gentiles.

Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not eccerc r_{2} know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice,²⁵but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. ²⁶Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter.²⁷He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."²⁸But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs."²⁹Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go-the demon has left your *daughter*." ³⁰So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. ³¹Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³²They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. ³⁴Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." ³⁵And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."





A Prayer for the Week:

Dear God, thank you for your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who comes to bring your reign of mercy and healing for our daily lives. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

Lord, as we thank you for much, bless those who have little. Give us hearts that care and hands that share. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the Lord lift you up, watch over you, and uphold you now and always. (Psalm 146:8-9)

Discuss in your home or small group:

- What is something that you experience as a challenge or limitation in life?
- How do you help others who experience challenges or limitations?
- In Isaiah 35:4-7a God promises to save us and to bring healing and hope to our daily lives. How do you see God bringing healing and hope to your life and to others around you?

Read: James 6:5-17.

This text shows the character of the people of God. God's reign in our lives makes a difference on how we treat others and how we are to be treated. As God treats us with mercy, so we are to treat others in ways that show mercy instead of dishonor, or mutual care instead of a standard that shows privilege to some over others. As verse 13 makes clear, there is judgment for not showing mercy. God's justice is to be taken seriously. And at the same time the great message of the Bible holds true: mercy triumphs over judgment. Instead of letting mercy lead us to indifference, it leads us to acts of love. This shows the power of a living faith that does works of compassion. Talk about how God has shown you mercy through others. How have you shown mercy to others? *Pray:* Lord, help us to open our hearts and minds to show mercy and acts of kindness to others. Amen.

Psalm 146:7 says that God gives food to hungry people. Caring for the hungry is an important way to show God's compassion for those in need. Help your congregation's outreach to those who are food insecure. It can be surprising how many people that includes within your own community. Make a financial contribution to an organization that helps to feed the hungry.

Mark 7:24-30 is a shocking text that shows a rougher side of Jesus' dialogue with someone in need. The woman's persistence in response to Jesus' words was itself an example of faith. Christian rituals and traditions provide disciplines that sustain us through the rocky times of life and faith. What are some rituals and traditions that have encouraged you as a follower of Jesus? Recommit yourself to these Christian practices that present God's word and Holy Spirit to keep you going day after day.
