

Amos 5:6-7, 10-15

Amos was a herdsman by profession and a prophet by God's call. During a time of great prosperity in the northern kingdom of Israel, the prophet speaks to the wealthy upper class. He warns his listeners that fulfilling God's demand for justice brings blessing, while corruption and oppression incur God's wrath.

Seek the LORD and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it. <sup>7</sup>Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground!

<sup>10</sup>They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth. <sup>11</sup>Therefore because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine. <sup>12</sup>For I know how many are your transgressions, and how great are your sins—you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and push aside the needy in the gate. <sup>13</sup>Therefore the prudent will keep silent in such a time; for it is an evil time. <sup>14</sup>Seek good and not evil, that you may live; and so the LORD, the God of hosts, will be with you, just as you have said. <sup>15</sup>Hate evil and love good, and establish justice in the gate; it may be that the LORD, the God of hosts, will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph.

## SECOND READING Hebrews 4:12-16

We cannot hide our thoughts, desires, and actions from God, to whom we are completely accountable. Nevertheless, Jesus understands our human weakness and temptations, because he also experienced them. Therefore we can approach the throne of grace to receive divine mercy from Christ.

Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. <sup>13</sup>And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account. <sup>14</sup>Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. <sup>15</sup>For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. <sup>16</sup>Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

#### THE HOLY GOSPEL

Mark 10:17-31

Jesus has been teaching his disciples about what is most valued in God's eyes. Now, a conversation with a rich man brings his message home to the disciples in a way that is surprising but unforgettable.

s [Jesus] was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, A "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>18</sup>Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. <sup>19</sup>You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.' "20He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." <sup>21</sup>Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." <sup>22</sup>When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. <sup>23</sup>Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" <sup>24</sup>And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! <sup>25</sup>It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." <sup>26</sup>They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" <sup>27</sup>Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." <sup>28</sup>Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." <sup>29</sup>Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, <sup>30</sup>who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. <sup>31</sup>But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."





Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. **Hebrews 4:16 (NRSV)** 

## A Prayer for the Week:

Gracious God, you give and you require both justice and mercy. As we receive your grace, lead us to others with your never-failing love. Amen.

#### **Mealtime Prayer:**

Lord, help us to share the food we receive and give gladly to any who are in need. Amen.

#### A Blessing to Give:

May God's word be at work in you. May the Lord give you strength in times of weakness and mercy in times of need. (Hebrews 4:12-16)

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Mercy is for those who need forgiveness. Tell about a time you showed mercy and kindness to someone.
- Talk about a time someone forgave you.
- The Bible makes it clear how our lives fall short of loving God (seeking the Lord) and loving our neighbor (justice for those in need). How have you experienced God's forgiveness and grace (grace means "undeserved kindness")?

Read: Amos 5:6-7, 10-15.

Amos is critical of the worship life of Israel. Bethel was a primary place to worship God, to "Seek the Lord" (v. 6). However, the worship life there is threatened because of a lack of justice that is described in verses 7 and 10-15. Where do you see around you Amos' (and God's) concern for corruption, mistreatment, and neglect of the poor, and lavish lifestyles? Amos wants the faithful to see that seeking God in worship includes seeking the righteous God in just treatment of others, especially the poor. How does your worship experience lead you to care for the needs of others?

*Pray:* God of justice and mercy, we thank you for the undeserved kindness you extend to us each day. Forgive us when we do not seek you in worship or in the needs of others. We pray through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Mark 10:17-31 is a tough passage about salvation and human wealth. Our wealth can clearly get in the way of God's mission (v. 23). God's gift of salvation is something that only God can accomplish for us (v. 27). Wealth and the power that goes with it challenge our ability to understand and care for others. Service requires a compassionate heart that feels the hurts and pains of others. Reflect on how your influence and power can get in the way of caring for others. Reflect on how a compassionate heart leads you to do acts of kindness.

In Mark 10:29-31 Jesus points out that his followers prosper with many family members and family possessions. Being part of the church gives us a large, even global family that presents us with a wealth of relationships to do God's work and will. Practice home hospitality, welcoming fellow neighbors and friends into your dwelling as a way to share your possessions and wealth with them. Offering a simple meal is a way to share the wealth of the kingdom of God. Use the *Mealtime Prayer* as part of your time of breaking bread together.
