The LORD watches over the strangers; he upholds the orphan and the widow, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin. Psalm 146:9 (NRSV)

Mealtime Prayer:

Saturday

Happy are those who hope in God. The Lord feeds the hungry and cares for the poor. Praise the Lord, O my soul! Praise the Lord! Amen. (Psalm 146:1, 5, 7-10)

A Blessing to Give:

May the Lord who watches over the hungry, the stranger, the orphan and widow, watch over you with steadfast love and faithfulness. (Psalm 146:7, 9)

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Tell about a time you felt you were in need of help from others.
- How have you helped someone else who was in need?
- It has been said that Jesus came to comfort the afflicted and to afflict the comfortable. Would you agree with this? Why or why not?

Read: 1 Kings 17:8-16.

Elijah goes to a foreign land where there is a foreign god, Baal, a fertility god, who is worshipped for having control over nature. The LORD (Yahweh in Hebrew), Elijah's God, sends Elijah to Zarephath in Sidon to be fed by a starving widow and mother. The woman, who has continued to prepare food down to the last morsel, acknowledges Elijah's God and provides hospitality with food and drink, although it will take all she has. She assumes she and her son will soon die, one way or another, for lack of food. The story lifts up the power of the LORD over a foreign god and the justice of the LORD for the needy. Abundance replaces starvation. Our actions reveal the powers we serve and trust. It is good to review our actions and where we place our confidence and hope. Reflect on your activities and commitments. Do they place trust in the power of governing rules (Psalm 146:3), in being respected and honored by others (Mark 12:38-39), in wealth (Mark 12:41), or is it trust in the LORD, the God of the Scriptures (Psalm 146:5)? The good news is that the God revealed in the Bible—and most fully in Jesus—is the one in whom we place our trust, a trust that does not disappoint. Praise the LORD! Pray: Lord God, thank you for watching over us. We pray for your care and protection for all who are in need. Amen.

Mark 12:38-44 tells us about a widow who gave two small coins, sometimes called *mites*. A mite box is used to save coins for charitable purposes. Set up a jar or box in your home as your household mite box. Throughout the year, place your loose change in it. Decide on where you will donate what is collected during the year.

November 11th is observed as Veterans Day in the United States and Remembrance Day or Armistice Day in other countries. It began as a day to observe the end of World War I and the sacrifice of those who participated in the war. It now represents the contributions of all veterans. It is a tradition to observe a minute of silence in memory and honor of those who lost their lives in military conflicts. Gather in your home and observe a minute of silence. Pray for the relatives of those who have lost loved ones in wars, for all those in military service, and for peace between nations.
