# OUR NEED for a SAVIOR

LESSON Genesis 3:1-15

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" <sup>2</sup>The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; <sup>3</sup>but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die." <sup>4</sup>But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; <sup>5</sup>for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." <sup>6</sup>So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. <sup>7</sup>Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

<sup>8</sup>They heard the sound of the Lord GOD walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord GOD among the trees of the garden. <sup>9</sup>But the Lord GOD called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" <sup>10</sup>He said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself." <sup>11</sup>He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" <sup>12</sup>The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate." <sup>13</sup>Then the Lord GOD said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent tricked me, and I ate." <sup>14</sup>The Lord GOD said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. <sup>15</sup>I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel."

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. <sup>19</sup>Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. <sup>20</sup>But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. <sup>21</sup>She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." <sup>22</sup>All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

# Jesus grows in wisdom.

## A Prayer for the Week:

Dear God, just as Jesus grew in wisdom and in a relationship to you and others, help us to grow in faith, hope, and love. Amen.

## **Mealtime Prayer:**

Lord Jesus, we thank you for this food that helps us grow and be healthy. Just as you were once a child, bring joy, love, and peace to all the children of the world. Amen.

# A Blessing to Give:

May the Lord give you wisdom and compassion as you grow in years and in your relationship to God and all people. (Luke 2:52)

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What is something you would like to learn about?
- How do you learn about the world around you?
- Iesus listened to teachers of the faith and asked questions. Who are some of your teachers of the faith?

### Read: Luke 6:84-52.

Luke is the only Gospel that tells us about Jesus' childhood. It is not easy to understand how the Son of God grows up, but Luke makes it clear in 2:40 and 2:52 that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor." Growth is part of life. Jesus as a human being experienced growth, too. He asked questions. What questions do you want to ask at this point in your life? At the end of the story of Jesus in the temple at age 12, it states that Mary "treasured all these things in her heart" (v. 51). Earlier, as a response to the message of the shepherds, we learn that "Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart" (2:19). The mother of Jesus, too, is growing in her understanding of Jesus. Like the child Jesus, and his mother Mary, we, too, grow in our lives of faith. As you look at your life of faith, where do you think you have grown in wisdom and in your relationship to God and others?

*Pray:* Dear God, help me to be open to your word and to the experiences around me, that I may continue to grow in love for you and in service to others, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

In the story of Jesus at the temple at age 12, his parents were not worried about their son as they returned home because Jesus was surrounded by "relatives and friends" (2:44). Parents need others to assist them in raising children. How could you help and support parents as they raise their children?

In Colossians 3:12-17 there is a beautiful passage that describes how Christians care for one another with love and forgiveness that reflects "compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience" (v. 12). Christians are to dwell in the word of Christ and to teach and correct one another with love and gratitude, in other words, not with arrogance or by bullying. A tradition for learning how to live the Christian life is to "sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God" (v. 16). The word hymn comes from Greek and means a song of praise. The music of the church is a gift that lifts our spirits and nurtures us in faith. Sing or pray the Hymn of the Week, *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, and be aware of how hymns and songs can form us in the Christian life and faith.
