## **EASTER VIGIL**



This is the night! This is our Passover with Christ from darkness to light, from bondage to freedom, from death to life. Tonight is the heart of our celebration of the Three Days and the pinnacle of the church's year. The resurrection of Christ is proclaimed in word and sign, and we gather around a pillar of fire, hear ancient stories of our faith, welcome new sisters and brothers at the font, and share the food and drink of the promised land. Raised with Christ, we go forth into the world, aflame with the good news of the resurrection.

#### LIGHT

Jesus Christ, rising in glory, dispels all darkness.

#### LUCERNARIUM: BLESSING OF THE FIRE AND THE CHRIST CANDLE

A blazing fire is prepared in the new courtyard and all are invited to gather around the fire before the liturgy starts. Each person will receive a candle and is invited to join the procession from the fire into the Nave. In the event of inclement weather, we invite you to gather in the Nave and the lighting of the new Paschal Candle will occur in the narthex. If you prefer to not join the procession for any reason, please take a candle and meet us in the Nave.

When the people are gathered, the clergy and the assisting ministers begin:

- P In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- Amen.
- P The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- **And also with you.**

The pastor welcomes the assembly and gives thanks over the new fire.

P On this most sacred night, in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life, the Church calls upon her children, scattered throughout the world, to come together to watch and pray. As we keep the memorial of the Lord's paschal solemnity in this way, listening to his word and celebrating his mysteries, let us have the sure hope of sharing his triumph over death and living with him in God.

Let us pray: O God, who through your Son bestowed upon the faithful the fire of your glory, grant that by these paschal celebrations, we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires, that with minds made pure and hearts sincere, we may, by your grace, receive festivities of unending splendor; through Christ our Lord.

C Amen.

While the assisting minister holds the Paschal Candle, the pastor traces the inscription on it:

- P Christ, yesterday and today +, the beginning and the ending. Alpha (A) and Omega ( $\Omega$ ); To Christ belongs all time and all the ages; to Christ belongs glory and dominion; now and forever.
- @ Amen.

The individual candles of the assembly are lit from the paschal candle.

- P The light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.
- C Amen.

#### **PROCESSIONAL**

The Paschal Candle leads the procession into the darkened nave. Along the way, the following acclamation is sung:

■ The light of Christ!

## HYMN FOR THE VIGIL OF EASTER (EXSULTET)

The assembly gathers in the darkened nave. We ask that you gather in the pews on the west side. Once the assembly is in place, the Exsultet is proclaimed.

This is the night, when once you led our forebears, Israel's children, from slavery in Egypt And made them pass dry-shod through the Red Sea. This is the night that with a pillar of fire you banished the darkness of sin. This is the night that even now, throughout the world, sets Christian believers apart from worldly vices and from the gloom of sin, leading them to grace and joining them to his holy ones.

This is the night, when Christ broke the prison bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld.

O wonder of your humble care for us!
O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!
O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!
O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a redeemer!

The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes fault away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners. O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to human.

Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that this candle, hallowed to the honor of your name, may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night. Receive it as a pleasing fragrance, and let it mingle with the lights of heaven. May this flame be found burning by the Morning Star: the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns forever and ever.

## WORD

The assembly gathers in the nave to hear the mighty works of God's creation and how God, in response to our human sin and limitation, reacts with devout love and singular purpose to heal and restore the human family. These readings speak of the whole arc of God's saving activity in human history, culminating in the Easter proclamation that will be God's final and ultimate act of salvation through self-giving love in the incarnation, death, and resurrection of Jesus, the Christ. Like a family gathered around a holiday table, it is a time to listen to our family story. We gather in darkness to hear again of God's love, who brings us out of darkness. We gather in darkness to remember why this night is so different from any other; to hear the resurrection promise in which the light of God's love now radiates throughout the whole world and for all time!

#### PRAYER AT THE FONT

Paul proclaims that all of those who are baptized into Jesus' death through baptism will inherit the promise of Christ's resurrection (Romans 6:3-5). Thus, we return again and again to our baptism and the promises of God that sustain us in joy and in sorrow. On this sacred night, as we await the joyous proclamation of the empty tomb, we reaffirm our baptism as an act of faith, knowing that God's grace and transformative love have the last word!

## **P** Let us humbly beseech the Lord our God.

Lord our God, in your mercy be present to your people who keep vigil on this most sacred night, as we recall the wondrous work of our creation and the still greater work of our redemption.

We give you thanks, O God, for you have created water and made it an instrument of mercy. In the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, so that this water may be for us a memorial of the Baptism we have received, and grant that we may share in the gladness of our brothers and sisters of every time and every place, for we are united in one faith, one Lord, one Baptism, in the everlasting company of saints on earth and in heaven.

#### AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

## **EASTER PROCLAMATION** (proclaimed 3 times)

The assembly stands as we all rejoice at the return of our Easter word, "Alleluia!" as we greet the Gospel. After the proclamation, the Altar Guild will dress the altar, restoring the splendor and beauty of Easter to the house of the Lord.

#### **HYMN OF PRAISE**

During the Hymn of Praise, a thurible is prepared with incense. Since the first Temple of Jerusalem, incense has been used in worship. Luther himself retained it and encouraged its use, especially during the reading of the Gospel and in preparation for the Eucharist.



## **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

GOSPEL John 20:1–18

John's Gospel describes the confusion and excitement of the first Easter: the stone is moved, disciples race back and forth, and angels speak to a weeping woman. Then, Jesus himself appears.

Larly on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. <sup>2</sup>So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." <sup>3</sup>Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. <sup>4</sup>The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. <sup>5</sup>He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. <sup>6</sup>Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, <sup>7</sup>and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. <sup>8</sup>Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; <sup>9</sup>for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. <sup>10</sup>Then the disciples returned to their homes.

<sup>11</sup>But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; <sup>12</sup>and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. <sup>13</sup>They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." <sup>14</sup>When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. <sup>15</sup>Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). <sup>17</sup>Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." <sup>18</sup>Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

#### THE TABLE IS PREPARED


On this joyous occasion, incense is used at the altar in preparation of the Lord's Supper. "The use of incense has a long history in both Judaism and Christianity. Incense is mentioned frequently in the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Gospel, Zechariah is in the temple at the time of the incense offering (Luke 1) and the gifts the Magi offered to the Christ Child included frankincense and myrrh. In Second Corinthians the knowledge of Christ is compared to a fragrant odor (2:14-16). The vision of heaven in Revelation includes the elders holding bowls of incense, described as the prayers of the saints (Revelation 5:8). The clouds of incense represent cleansing and purification, and the sweet smell suggests Christ's robe of righteousness that covers our sin. It also symbolizes the great cloud of witnesses (angels, apostles, martyrs, and saints) who join their prayers of praise and thanksgiving to ours around the everlasting throne of the Lamb of God. 'May our prayers arise before him as incense!'"






#### WORDS OF INSTITUTION



# The resurrected Jesus changes who we are.

These passages are related to the Lectionary texts for this Sunday.

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Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). John 20:16 (NRSV)

## A Prayer for the Week:

God of power and might, give us joy in the good news of Jesus' victory over death that we may celebrate life in his name each and every day. Amen.

## **Mealtime Prayer:**

Christ is risen! Alleluia! For the power of resurrection to give life and for the gift of this food, we give you thanks through Christ Jesus our Lord. Alleluia! Amen.

## A Blessing to Give:

May the words "Christ is risen" bring you joy. Alleluia!

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- Our lives are influenced by those around us. How have others influenced who you are?
- How does believing in Jesus and his resurrection influence your life today?

## Read: John 20:1-18.

John's resurrection account brings together important themes from the Gospel. John 1 begins as a new creation story, imitating the language of Genesis 1. This new creation—born again—language is continued on the lips of Jesus in John 3:3-8. The empty tomb experience takes place in a garden where Mary thinks Jesus is the gardener. The setting reminds us of the origins of human life in the Garden of Eden. In John 1:39 Jesus invites the disciples to "Come and see" where Jesus is staying. After the resurrection, Mary says to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord." Mary's new birth as a follower of the resurrected Lord is seen in her recognition not only of Jesus but of her own identity and calling as a disciple. Jesus calls her by name and in that moment, she not only sees Jesus as her teacher, but her role as student and disciple. The resurrection for Mary is a very personal recognition of the resurrected Jesus and her new life as a disciple who has seen the Lord.

*Discuss:* How does the recognition of Jesus' resurrection impact your life of faith?

*Pray:* Almighty God, help us to see in Jesus' resurrection, our calling as followers of the Lord and those who share love, hope, and good news with others. Amen.

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you encourage someone with love and hope in Jesus' name?

The word Easter means "spring." Easter ushers in new life. Plant an Easter Garden with colorful flowers like pansies, tulips, and petunias. If you buried or hid the word "Alleluia" on Transfiguration Sunday, display it in a visible place in your home during the Easter season or laminate it and place it on a stick in your Easter garden. As the garden grows during the fifty days of Easter, recall Mary in the garden with her Lord and remember that Jesus has given you a new identity as a follower of Jesus. When you look at your Easter Garden, say: **Alleluia! Christ is risen.**
