Deuteronomy 30:9-14

Moses calls the people who are about to enter the promised land to renew the covenant God made with their ancestors. Through this covenant God gives life and asks for obedience. God's commandment is neither burdensome nor too far off, but dwells in the people's hearts.

Grace to you and peace from God our Father.


³In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, ⁵because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel ⁶that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. ⁷This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, ⁸and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. ¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 10:25-37

Jesus is challenged to explain what is involved in obeying the greatest commandment. He tells a parable rich in surprises: those expected to show pity display hard hearts while the lowly give and receive unexpected and lavish mercy.

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" ²⁷He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

²⁹But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. ³¹Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ³²So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. ³⁴He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' ³⁶Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

"Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He [The lawyer] said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise." Luke 10:36-37 (NRSV)

A Prayer for the Week:

God of steadfast love, help us to welcome all people that we meet each day with kindness and mercy through Jesus our Lord. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

With the fruit of the earth, you feed us, good Lord. With love and care you sustain us each day through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May God rescue you from the power of darkness and bring you into the kingdom of God's beloved Son, Jesus. (Colossians 1:13)

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- How would you describe a good neighbor?
- Tell or think of a story of how you or someone you know has been a good neighbor.

Read: Luke 10:25-37.

Understanding who my neighbor is can be an issue in today's world. We often define who is an insider and who is an outsider, someone not needing or deserving of our care. Jesus turns that focus on its head. If you were in need, like the man robbed, beaten, and left for dead, whose help would you accept? Anyone's help, of course, even someone you despised. It was a Samaritan who helped the man who was left for dead. In the Jewish world of Jesus' day, a Samaritan was someone who was not a pure Jew but a mixture of nationalities brought in by foreign rulers. A Samaritan was also someone whose faith was not consistent with Jewish teachings. A Samaritan was despised yet used by Jesus to show who a neighbor is and what a real neighbor does.

Discuss: Who in your life would you describe as a good Samaritan and why?

Pray: Merciful God, help me to see in others someone who I can serve and to whom I can turn to when I need help in daily life, for the sake of Jesus Christ, my Savior, Lord, and Neighbor. Amen.

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you be a good neighbor?

Speaking through Moses, God told the people of Israel that the word was in their mouths and in their hearts so that they would obey it (Deuteronomy 30:14). Begin each day this week by reciting these words from Luke 10:27: Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself.
