

#### FIRST READING Isaiah 42:1-9

SECOND READING Acts 10:34-43

Peter crosses the sharp religious boundary separating Jews from Gentiles and proclaims the good news of God's inclusive forgiveness in Jesus' name to Cornelius, a Roman centurion. As a result of Peter's preaching, Cornelius and his family become the first Gentiles to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.


Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup>but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to God. <sup>36</sup>You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. <sup>37</sup>That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup>We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; <sup>40</sup>but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, <sup>41</sup>not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup>He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup>All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."







"You know the message he [God] sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced. Acts 10:36-37 (NRSV)

## A Prayer for the Week:

Dear God, we thank you for the ministry of Jesus that began with his baptism and announced that he is your Son and the Beloved. Amen.

## **Mealtime Prayer:**

Lord God, we thank you that through your glory and strength, you give us food from your crea-tion and send us out in Jesus' name. Amen. (Psalm 29:1)

## A Blessing to Give:

May you go forth knowing you are a beloved child of God.

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What gives you strength and confidence to do things each day?
- What does it mean to you that you are God's beloved child?

#### Read: Acts 10:34-48.

Just prior to Peter baptizing Cornelius (a Roman soldier) and others in his household, Peter speaks and says he now realizes that all—not just Jews—are acceptable to God. Peter speaks of Jesus and his ministry that began with the baptism of John and Jesus' anointing "with the Holy Spirit and with power" (v. 38). Jesus' baptism by John is not the same as our baptism, but Peter does make a clear connection. The same Holy Spirit that is at Jesus' baptism is also at our baptism. As Cornelius and his group heard Peter's sermon about Jesus, the circumcised believers present were amazed that this non-Jewish community had received the Holy Spirit. Because of that, Peter was compelled to baptize all of them. Jesus' baptism leads to his public ministry just as our baptism leads us by the power of the Holy Spirit to witness to what God has done and continues to do through Christ our Lord. Our own baptism and that of others creates an opportunity to witness to the Christian faith.

Discuss: How does a baptism give someone an opportunity to speak about the Christian faith?

*Pray:* God of power and might, just as Jesus received the Holy Spirit and power in his baptism, empower us in ours to speak of your saving work through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this week, how might you show the Christian faith through actions and words?

Jesus' baptism by John leads Jesus into his public ministry filled with the power of the Holy Spirit. Since the New Testament, baptism has initiated our life in Christ to go out into the world in Jesus' name. Make a list of how you would like to be empowered by God to do good and to bring God's healing power to others. Bless one another with these words: **Go out in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit with the peace of God meant for all.**
