GOOD FRIDAY ADORATION of the CROSS



At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the passion according to John, which proclaims Jesus as a triumphant king who reigns from the cross. The ancient title for this day—the triumph of the cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. In the ancient bidding prayer we offer petitions for all the world for whom Christ died. Today's liturgy culminates in the Easter Vigil tomorrow evening.

PROCESSION OF THE CROSS

Please stand as the Sanctus bells are rung.

A cross is placed in front of the altar.

Silent prayer.

P Almighty and eternal God,
your Spirit guides the church and makes it holy.
Strengthen and uphold our bishops, pastors, deacons,
seminarians, and lay leaders.
Keep them in health and safety for the good of the church,
and help each of us in our various vocations
to do faithfully the work to which you have called us.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

P Let us pray for those preparing for baptism.

Silent prayer.

P Almighty and eternal God, you continue to bless the church.
Increase the faith and understanding of those preparing for baptism.
Give them new birth as your children,
and keep them in the faith and communion of your holy church.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

G Amen.

P Let us pray for those who share our faith in Jesus Christ.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God, you give your church unity.
Look with favor on all who follow Jesus your Son.
Make all the baptized one in the fullness of faith,
and keep us united in the fellowship of love.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

G Amen.

- P** Let us pray for the Jewish people, the first to hear the word of God.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God,
long ago you gave your promise to Abraham and your teaching to Moses.
Hear our prayers that the people you called and elected as your own
may receive the fulfillment of the covenant's promises.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

G Amen.

- P** Let us pray for those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God, gather into your embrace
all those who call out to you under different names.
Bring an end to inter-religious strife,
and make us more faithful witnesses
of the love made known to us in your Son.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

G Amen.

- P** Let us pray for those who do not believe in God.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God, you created humanity
so that all may long to know you and find peace in you.
Grant that all may recognize the signs of your love and grace
in the world and in the lives of Christians,
and gladly acknowledge you as the one true God.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

- P** Let us pray for God's creation.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God,
you are the creator of a magnificent universe.
Hold the cosmos in the arms of your care
and bring all things to fulfillment in you.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

- P** Let us pray for those who serve in public office.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God,
you are the champion of the poor and oppressed.
In your goodness, give wisdom to those in authority,
so that all people may enjoy justice, peace, freedom,
and a share in the goodness of your creation.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

- P** Let us pray for those in need.

Silent prayer.

- P** Almighty and eternal God,
you give strength to the weary
and new courage to those who have lost heart.
Heal the sick, comfort the dying, give safety to travelers,
free those unjustly deprived of liberty,
and deliver your world from falsehood, hunger, and disease.
Hear the prayers of all who call on you in any trouble,
that they may have the joy of receiving your help in their need.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

G Amen.

- P** Finally, let us pray for all those things for which our Lord would have us ask.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

- G** Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Worshipers may leave in silence or remain for silent meditation.
This service continues with the Vigil of Easter on Saturday at 10:00 PM.
