It seems we are just barely out of the Christmas season and yet Lent is right around the corner. This year Lent begins on Valentines Day - Wednesday, February 14. Which is just one reason it feels appropriate that this year our Lenten theme will be "Created for Community". As I write this, the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday is not far past. MLK was all about the Beloved Community - he preached about it throughout his too-short life and it was the vision that compelled him to keep pushing us forward as a nation towards a society in which everyone flourished together, a world where poverty, hatred, and abuse were deliberately laid aside in favor of love. This Lent, in our Wednesday midweek services, we will be guided by the gospel of Mark to reflect on what it means to live into the Beloved Community Jesus ushers us into - a Kingdom in which we are in community with our siblings in Christ, with the world, with our neighbors on the margins, with all of creation, and with God our Creator.

For centuries Christians have used the season of Lent as a time to take up extra spiritual practices, or disciplines. Those words can be intimidating, and the practice of Lenten disciplines can be easily misunderstood. The disciplines of Lent are NOT a second chance at our New Year's resolutions, for example. You or I may well need to resolved to eat better, clean out the clutter from our closets, or use kinder, gentler language when we're frustrated - but those disciplines in and of themselves have nothing to do with Lent practices. Lent is also NOT about making ourselves more spiritual - adding extra bible readings or prayers. If anything, Lent is a time when we are reminded that no matter how "spiritual" we are in our habits, we are still sinners in need of a Savior. No amount of trying harder will make us more acceptable to God! That is the bad news...

The Good News is, of course, the Good News of Easter – that God has sent a Savior and because of Jesus, we are acceptable to God – not by our own spiritual practices or good hearts, but by Jesus's obedient life and death. AND, even better news, we are rescued from all the brokenness

and evil in the world and in ourselves, even the evil of death, because of Jesus's resurrection! Allelu... oops - not yet! So, why do any Lenten "disciplines" at all? The practices we pick up in Lent are all about clearing out space, time, consciousness in our busy, routine, cluttered, noisy lives for us to become closer to God, and to see our lives, our world, our neighbors through God's eves. To practice being more who God created us to be. Together. So that we are more ready, not to be accepted by God - that's a done deal already - but to live in communion with God, to live in relationship with the world in God's way. I sometimes phrase it this way - Lent gets us ready for the party! Lent prepares us to be God's people who party God's way at the great Feast of the Kingdom - the celebration of Easter. And that party is all about that Beloved Community we were created from the beginning to be part of. So as you pick out a Lenten practice this year, think about something that will lead you deeper into that identity. And join us as we learn and journey together at Kountze.

NEWS<u>& Notes...</u>



December 19, 2023

Meeting called to order at 6:09 PM.

The minutes were adopted and approved from November's council meeting.

Finance: Financial Report received. November numbers show a negative balance YTD of \$48,000, however we were in a better position than last year which at this time last year was over \$100,000 negative. Motion made - and passed unanimously - to move \$500,000 from the money held in savings from the DeFrease Manor Fund to a CD with Dundee Bank. A second Motion was made - and passed unanimously - moving \$300,000 from the M. Bock estate into a CD with Dundee Bank for a term of 3 months.

Staff Reports: Accepted by council. Sunday School to begin January 14, 2024. Pastor Wynard discussed looking at the new Associaate Pastor position and keeping an open mind for what the position is called (i.e. Associate Pastor v. Lay Minister) and what the position may entail. Pastor Duminy noted a lessened support on the Advent Tree - goal was \$4,500.

Old Business: Servant Keeper Access was discussed. (Prior to the present discussion, the council noted multiple

prior discussions regarding whether the Executive Director of Kountze Commons should be granted access to such information) Discussion held regarding weather with assigned confidentiality agreement and fiduciary obligations if it was appropriate that the executive director now be granted permission. Discussion then held whether it should ultimately be up to the Senior Pastor to decide who ultimately makes the decision. During the conversation a motion was made - unanimously approved - to allow Servant Keeper Access to Pastor Wynard and Executive Director Jill Conway.

Discussions regarding smoke-free campus continued until next meeting.

Council Retreats & Next steps: continue review and discussion on purpose statements and creating an editable version to complete by each committee.

New Business: Attracting new/younger congregants. Topic tabled until next meeting.

Lara McCormick made a motion to allow a girl scout troop to meet at Kountze.

Calendar notes: Motion made - unanimously passed - to push our Annual Meeting to Feb. 18 (from the originally scheduled Feb. 11 date). This, the budget forum will now be moved to Feb. 11.


Council adjourned at 8:03 PM.

Alex Michaelides was born and raised in Cyprus and lives in London. He was a screenwriter and this is his first novel. The novel is based on the Greek myth of Alcentis, who refused to speak after she was reunited with her husband.

This is a suspenseful story about Alicia Berenson who shot her husband 5 times in the face and then refused to speak again. She was admitted to a psychiatric facility in London, where psychotherapist, Theo Faber, works with Alicia to try to get her to speak and uncover the mystery of her husband's murder. The ending of the book is a twist no one anticipates and the seasoned suspense reader is shocked. The mystery of Agatha Christie and suspense of Alfred Hitchcock are revealed in the ending.
