

Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

are intended to build up the whole body of Christ, so that together we might share the Good News of God's abundant mercy and grace. We need each other and we need you!

I also want to invite your patience, participation and creativity & curiosity as we live into these Ministry Areas and the mission God is calling us to together in the months and years ahead. As I write we're right on the cusp of Holy Week and one of the phrases echoing in my mind is, "together with the whole church...". This is one of those weeks in the liturgical year when we can say with good confidence that "together with the whole church" we enter into a time of pondering the somber and joyful salvation that comes to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Christians around the world, of every denomination and language, are reading the story at the heart of our faith, beholding Christ on the cross, and rejoicing at the empty tomb.

What does that have to do with Ministry Areas and Kountze?? Well, I believe that "together with the whole church" we stand at a crossroads of culture and history. The road ahead for what it means to be church in society is unclear – because it is untrodden. The church of the future will look different. Together with the whole church we – especially your pastors, Council, and staff – are asking questions like:

- How do we engage families, youth & young adults, new comers without Lutheran backgrounds... in their faith?
- What do our neighbors need from us in these days? How do we show God's love, especially to those with deep needs?
- How do we clearly communicate who we are & what we believe especially when there are so many assumptions and competing voices about what Christians and Christianity is?
- What programs should we be letting go of and what new things should we be trying?

 What should church look like these days? What changes do we need to make?

None of us has really clear, concrete answers to these questions. And that means that any schema or diagram or list of activities is a working draft. So consider those main Ministry Areas to be fairly set – even if their names or descriptions might shift slightly. But the boxes under them, filled with committees and activities, are anything but set! Together with the whole church we are "experimenting" our way into a new way of being God's people in the world. Our identity as beloved children of God, worshiping, growing and serving, will not change – but our methods and programs almost certainly will. It will take us time and some trial and error to figure out what is the right fit for us, for our gifts, and for our wider community. As we do, the Ministry Areas are a guide to help us experiment well and invite everyone's participation.

I hope that excites and intrigues you – and most of all I hope you will join us on this journey with God into the future God is calling us to, Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. We may not know what lies ahead, but God is with us and intends this journey to lead to blessing for us, and for all. Where would you like to plug in and even experiment with something new in the coming months? I'd love to hear about it!



NEWS & Notes...



Meeting called to order. Previous minutes approved with amendment. Meeting agenda adopted.

Devotions and snacks provided by Steve Hinrichs
Ministry site profile: looking to form a transition team
as we look forward to our future needs as a church and
congregation. Looking to build this team to be led by a
member of the congregation. This group would be made
up of congregation members, a council member, and Pastor
Lucy. The work would comprise of evaluating current
strengths and opportunities to better identify pastoral
needs as Pastor Shari transitions away from Kountze.
Working with the Nebraska Synod to clarify the process
and next formal steps. Requesting a Synod member comes
to a future council meeting to talk through the process.
Transition team will gather feedback from current pastors,
ask for congregation input, and update the congregation at
future forum.

Personnel committee: looking to add members to the personnel committee per the bylaws. Pastor Lucy will be responsible for adding members.

7 areas of ministry: continue working on identifying and naming 7 areas of ministry. Will engage the congregation in these ministries during a few March forums. Each area of ministry will establish a goal of growth and community and work with their communities and areas of influence to establish the specific goals. Each area of ministry will produce their purpose statement, activities, and volunteer opportunities by March 1. Council rep is responsible to ensure the area of ministry document is filled out and submitted to Debbie to include in the council packet. This can be included with minutes submitted and should be a high-level document to show progress and identify areas of opportunity or needs for support from the council.

Website update: we are in the final stages. Gathering pictures for use.

Smokefree campus: we will address and discuss further at March council meeting.

Undesignated funds and deFreese Mannor funds: We feel this needs additional attention and will be setting up a separate meeting to move forward with how we will address these funds.

Synod assembly delegates: we are looking for up to 7 delegates (not including the pastoral staff) for the Synod Assembly in Kearney, NE June 1 and 2. Let Pastor Lucy

know of names you would like to nominate to go.

Council Leadership retreat: planning annual council leadership retreat on September 14 with a dinner the night before. The planning committee will meet to discuss agenda.

Staff reports given and approved by council.
Committee reports given and approved by council.
Motion to accept final report moved and approved.
Motion and approval to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was closed by the Lord's Prayer.

March 12, 2024

The Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church Council meeting was called to order at 6 PM on March 12, 2024, by Pastor Lucy Wynard.

Pastor Wynard started the meeting by asking if there were any items other than the deFreese Manor sale proceeds and undesigned memorial funds to be discussed during the meeting. The Council members agreed that no other items needed to be discussed.

The Council members reviewed the document provided and prepared by Mike Jensen regarding the deFreese Manor sale proceeds. This document provided information related to the total amount of the deFreese Manor sale and the resulting disbursement of these funds.

The Council members discussed the potential use of the remaining funds. Some of these funds are in six-month CDs at Dundee Bank (\$500,000) earning 5.4%. The are additional funds of \$255,858.45 that are not invested for a total of \$755,858.45.

Tim Backora reported that the church had received more than \$600,000 in undesignated memorial funds and that \$300,000 of these funds had been put in a three-month CD. The remainder of these funds are in the checking account. The total potential funds available for planning purposes is close to \$1.4 million.

Numerous suggestions on how these funds could be used to grow the mission of the church were discussed. There were discussions related to the potential for new programs for the church that would add new direction(s) for Kountze.

Pastor Lucy encouraged the Council not to look at the Mission of Kountze through the lens of fear but to be bold.

Pastor Hall suggested that any plans take into consideration Kountze's community partners.

It was suggested that conversations be held with the Kountze Endowment regarding cooperative funding efforts

between the two entities (Kountze Council and Kountze Endowment). Cooperation between the Council and Endowment is critical given the upcoming needs of the Church building. Jim Smejkal is preparing a list of Church upkeep needs that will be provided to the Council.

It was suggested that seed money of \$350,000 be directed to programs that would enhance the vision and the programs of the church and also be available to jump-start new programs.

Pastor Lucy reported that changes in the Church's insurance coverage require that we have a deductible of \$350,000 for each wind or hail event the building claims. This is equivalent to one percent of the total evaluation of the church and property.

The Cathedral model of a church was raised. Pastor Hall pointed out that Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church is presently functioning as a Cathedral model. People in the neighborhood love this church, whether members formally or not.

Jacob moved that the total funds of \$1.46 million be allocated as follows: \$800,000 be placed in an investment fund that can be drawn from the \$400,000 be placed in a new mission seed monies fund, and approximately \$246,000 be available for immediate use. After considerable discussion, Mike moved to table the motion until the Council meeting on March 19, 2024, to allow additional time for input on the use of these funds. The motion to table the proposal was seconded and passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:58 PM.

Do You Hear a Call?

At Easter service 2019 I walked through the doors of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church for service. The warm greeting I received from members of the congregation was immediate. I still remember looking around in awe of the beauty of the church from the balcony. It didn't take long, and I could feel the Holy Spirit working through me and



releasing pains I had felt for so long from being away from a church service. It didn't take long for me to feel at home and by my third service I was asking how I may serve the church. Through the years from being on the deFreese Manor Council, Choir, Usher, Altar Guild, Lector, Communion Assistant, Kountze Café, Christmas Deco Committee, and OSI leader, I have found that the call was deeper, and I needed to listen to what the Lord wanted. I give special thanks to my mentor, Pastor Paul Moessner, who has been and will continue to be my mentor throughout this journey. For all the pastors of this church and for the knowledge and support you have shown, I want to express a huge Thank You. As I leave Kountze to now serve as the Shepherd and Vicar of Bethel Lutheran, I will take all the love and friendship you have shown through the years and carry on the good Stewardship.

Lessons In Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus



This is a bestselling debut novel by Bonnie Garmus which is witty and well written. Garmus has created a brilliant character, Elizabeth Zott, who is a feminist in a man's world. Elizabeth graduated from UCLA in 1961 with a major in chemistry, which was not a frequent choice for women in the 1960's. She found that working in an all-male 1950's sexist lab at Hastings Research she was not treated with equality by her peers, except for one, Calvin Evans, who advised her to "not work smart, but outsmart the system".

When Elizabeth finds herself as a single Mom with a daughter and a brilliant dog, she demonstrates how an intelligent woman can succeed in a man's world.

She becomes the host of a cooking show, Supper at Six, and teaches women the chemistry of cooking as well as how to change women's role in society. The novel has been adapted to a T.V. mini series starring Brie Larson.

This is a thought-provoking novel to encourage readers to think of how to change our society to open up opportunities for women and remove the 1950's stigma of the "housewife woman". Readers will find this a laugh-out loud story with a great cast of supportive characters.

Following a short book discussion at the meeting, the group will adjourn to The Bookworm to select books for our next year's reading list.
