January felt like it was at least 6 months long, and February has felt like about 6 days - at least from my perspective! I think that's partly the weather, perhaps, and partly the busyness of the Lenten season we're now in as well as the busyness of my own life. Before we get to Easter, though, and all the other things looming this spring (graduations, travel, summer plans...) - would you take a moment with me and consider our Lenten theme again: Created for Community.

In March your Kountze Council will be taking a couple of Adult Forum times, on March 10 and 17, to share with you some of the work we've been doing in the last few months as we think about our future together. We have set some goals - some broad, some more specific - around growth and engagement. We want to see Kountze become more connected: with one another, with the ministry we share here, with our neighbors in the community around us, and most of all with God and God's work happening in our world. One technical thing Council has done - which we will share more about in those forums - is organize the groups and activities that exist around here into Seven Ministry Areas. The goal is not any significant change in the activities themselves, but rather to streamline the way we communicate. We hope this will help us better convey to people ways they can get connected, better communicate between our leadership and the various groups, and together be more focused on where and how God is leading us.

So how does this affect you? And what does it have to do with Lent and our theme of Created for Community? Well, that's what I'm asking you to reflect on! This Lent we're exploring the ways God made us to be in community - connected to - with all of creation, with all the people of God, with our neighbors, with those on the margins, and with Christ. How is your connection to those communities God made you to be a part of? Where is your sense of connection strong? Where is it weak? Please do NOT hear me asking you to DO more. This isn't about doing, it's about being - being who God created us to be in communion, connection, with one another. Sometimes we have to do less in order to be well connected. Sometimes, perhaps often, our busyness actually gets in the way of true community.

We all flourish together as a church when everyone's gifts are welcomed and used, and everyone's needs are acknowledged and addressed. We all have gifts to offer in the body of Christ, and we need each other so that we might all grow stronger in faith, hope, and love. And not only do we flourish - we are able to contribute to the flourishing of our neighbors, our wider community, and all creation. So would you take some time this month to ponder - where do you need to strengthen your connections? And join us March 10 and 17 to think about how God is leading us as Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church to be a stronger, more connected community worshiping, growing, and serving together.

Holy Communion is offered weekly at all three weekend liturgies which use resources from Evangelical Lutheran Worship:


Committee reports given and approved by Council. Finance: Over \$11,000 net income for December. Social Ministry: attempting to come up with a mission statement.


