



Our youth and young adults need your support! As you may already know, this year is the triennial ELCA Youth Gathering – though, thanks to COVID-19, it's now been 6 years since the last Gathering. The theme of this year's event is "Created to Be", based on Psalm 139:14, "I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully



Why should you support our young people in this endeavor? I've recently talked to some Kountze parents of school-aged children who themselves went to the Youth Gathering as young adults. And I heard what I hear all the time from Gathering participants – it was lifechanging! Particularly it was faith-changing. For Gathering participants, this is a chance to explore and experience first-hand their faith being challenged, affirmed, celebrated and solidified as theirs, not just their parents' or their church's faith. I firmly believe the Gathering is one significant way we can help students stay on a path to life-long, vibrant faith and church involvement!

How can I support the youth and young adults going to the Gathering? I'm so glad you asked! First you can pray and ask questions – especially as our young people return – to show you're genuinely interested and excited to hear about their experiences. Second, you can contribute



financially. 

NEWS & Notes...



Kate Jones opened the meeting with devotions and a prayer.

The meeting was called to order by Pastor Wynard at 6:02 PM.

The agenda was reviewed and approved.

Minutes of the February 20, 2024, Council meeting and the March 12, 2024 meeting were presented and approved.

Pastor Wynard introduced Pastor Greg Berger, Assistant to the Bishop of the Lutheran Synod. Pastor Berger reviewed the process of obtaining an Associate Pastor or a Deacon. Two documents developed by the Synod (Discover and Invite, Roster Transition Call Manual) will be electronically available to the Council members.

Jill Conway, Executive Director of Kountze Commons, was introduced by Pastor Wynard. Jill provided an update on the community connections she is forging.

The KCCOC Board addressed the smoke-free campus issue and the decision was made that the campus will remain smoke-free.

The two March forums delineating the seven areas of ministry were well received by congregational members who attended. The Ministry Areas email protocol draft was reviewed, discussed, and accepted.

The new website for Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church is very close to being released. A photographer is being sought to assist with updating the website photos.

The undesignated memorial funds were again discussed.

A question was raised regarding whether the income collected by KETV for rent covers the expenses of Kountze Commons. While this will be clarified further.

There was further discussion regarding the property committee's report outlining needed capital improvements/long-term maintenance needs. Steve Hinrichs moved that up to \$60,000 be made available to support three of the projects (penthouse roof replacement, removing the caulking and re-caulking the main church capstone, and obtaining a mechanical systems assessment and analysis) that need immediate attention. The motion was seconded and carried.

A discussion was held regarding what the Endowment would be able to pay for as it relates to the list of capital improvements/long-term maintenance.

The Personnel Committee's recommendations

regarding the temporary choir director positions and financial requirements were presented. Tim Backora moved that the Council accept the Personnel Committee's recommendations for the temporary choir director. The motion was seconded and carried.

Tim Backora presented February's financial report. Kate Jones moved that the financial report as presented be accepted. The motion was seconded and carried.

Pastor Duminy reported that the Christian Education Fund for summer camp at Carol Joy Holling will most likely need additional funding due to the tremendous response to the Kountze program. The exact amount will be determined at a later date.

Pastor Duminy will put together a list of the responsibilities of the breakfast director. With her pending departure, the need for a replacement director is needed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 PM with the Lord's Prayer.



Homelessness in Omaha

Kountze Commons Community Outreach Center's partners serve our neighbors, including our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Tamara Dwyer, Homeless Services Coordinator for the City of Omaha Mayor's Office, presented at KCCOC for its partners and volunteers on April 12, 2024. Her presentation "Homelessness in Omaha" focused on terminology, statistics, resources, services, and best practices.

The Mayor's Task Force on homelessness was created to prevent and end homelessness in Omaha. Strategies include active location conferencing (i.e. encampment response and clean up), emergency rehousing, veteran homelessness targeting, and homelessness prevention lead by the Metro Area Continuum of Care for the Homeless ("MACCH") and the Institute for Community Alliances ("ICA").

Dwyer's presentation recommended treating people experiencing homelessness like any other neighbor with respect and safety in mind. When encountering neighbors experiencing homelessness, the following Best Practices were recommended:

- Make eye contact and talk kindly to people who are without homes—they are your neighbors too.
- Encourage/help people to call or visit service providers • like those through MACCH. The message line for MACCH Street Outreach is 402-957-1747 or call 2-1-1. There is also the Siena Francis House, Open Door Mission, Stephen Center, or other day drop in centers.
- If someone is being disruptive, homeless or not, try to de-escalate the situation if you are comfortable doing so.
- In non-emergency situations, call the Mayor's Office at (402) 444-5555 or Omaha police at the non-emergency line at (402) 444-4877.
- If someone is threatening harm to self or others, acting recklessly or violently, or having delusions, call 9-1-1 and ask for a mental health-trained officer or co responder.
- If you want to help someone experiencing homelessness, do not offer food or money, unless you are equipped and willing to continue that generosity.



- As a property owner,
 - Ensure there is good lighting in your area.



- Keep the area in front of your home or property clean and well maintained. Keeping your area clean encourages others to respect the area.
- Provide places for people to put their trash.
- Let businesses and residents know to inform people of their boundaries on their property. If people are doing something illegal and will not leave, call the police.
- If someone is sleeping/loitering on your property:
 - Establish a friendly relationship. Introduce yourself. Ask for the person's name. Contact the City of **Omaha Homeless Services Coordinator.**
 - Politely ask them to leave using sincere empathetic • language that deflects the request from yourself to a third party (e.g. "the property owner is asking you to leave" even if that person is you).
 - Let people know where they can go for services, as opposed to only where they cannot be.
 - If they are not cooperative, let them know if they do • not leave you are going to call the police, but would rather not do so. Avoid confrontation and keep a safe distance. If you or others feel threatened in any way, if they become disruptive or dangerous, call 9-1-1.

Dwyer emphasized that many organizations directly help people experiencing homelessness and work to increase affordable housing. She suggested finding an organization that you want to support, and asking them what they need. Omaha's Homeless Service Coordinator and service providers know how to help our homeless neighbors. The more you support them, the more they can help people get off the streets and into stable housing. Dwyer also recommended advocating within your circle of influence to help make things better for our neighbors who are homeless. This will help our entire community.
