

10 Simple Ideas for a Spiritually Rich Summer*

- 1. Relax and enjoy the sunshine! The beauty & warmth this time of year are gifts from God.
- 2. Look & think back to your New Year's resolutions or Lenten disciplines. Now *realistically* rewrite those goals & rededicate yourself to them.
- 3. Dust off the bible on your night stand. Read a psalm everyday for the next month. You will find plenty of encouragement there. And since this is the lectionary year for Mark (the shortest gospel), read through that book it's a great, quick beach read!
- Every new season is a new beginning in a broken relationship choose to forgive and start anew. (Perhaps the person you most need to forgive is yourself?)
- 5. Ask your kids, grandkids, or neighbor kids how they've seen or experienced God lately. All too often we only tell kids what to believe rather than listening to them about their faith firsthand. But kids have such wonderful faith of their own to share with us!
- 6. Take your best friend, significant other or a church friend out for a meal. Be intentional about discussing where you are at spiritually and how you want to grow.
- Give journaling a try or try a new way. I recommend "Journaling in the Round" or "Praying in Color", especially for those who find the idea of journaling overwhelming. (Google those phrases or ask me for more info.)
- 8. Volunteer somewhere new just once, to check it



out. Perhaps it's the Kountze Food Pantry or at our Neighborhood Gathering, or perhaps at the Humane Society, a local senior center, or with refugees new to our city. ShareOmaha.org is a great resource to find a good fit for you.

9. It's tempting when the weather gets nice to skip church. I get it! But keep in mind how vital it is to

keep plugged in with God through your connection to God's people. There's lots of exciting mission & ministry that happens in the summer months – make plans to be part of it! (And also... it's okay to skip church once in a while – see #10...)

10. Did I mention relax and enjoy the sunshine? Eugene Peterson, the theologian and pastor who translated The Message version of the Bible, writes about keeping Sabbath by both praying AND playing. He says, "Praying and playing share this quality: they develop and mature with age, they don't go into decline. Prayerfulness and playfulness reverse the deadening effects of sindetermined lives. They... counter boredom, reduce anxieties, push, pull, direct, prod us into the fullness of our humanity..."

(Working the Angles, pg. 78) Where can you make room in your life for a little more of both?

Holy Communion is offered weekly at all three weekend liturgies which use resources from Evangelical Lutheran Worship:

NEWS & Notes...



Pastor Wynard called the meeting to order and the agenda was adopted.

Previous minutes approved as amended

Old Business. Discussion was had regarding Council Report form and Ministry area missions statements. Council Report form does not replace committee minutes. Council Report form is used to highlight matters for Council's consideration. Property Ministry and Leadership Ministry mission statements are still needed. Council discussed and distinguished between being a council representative vs. a council liaison, and agreed to use council liaison when appropriate. Council considered how best to access an archive or database of meeting minutes. Unspent funds proposal team is set to meet on May 1st.

New Business. Council accepted the resignation of Madeline O'Kane as council secretary. Council expressed their appreciation of her services as secretary and is grateful that she will remain on Council. Mike Jensen was appointed as council secretary. A general update was given by Pastor Wynard regarding the Farnam streetcar project, which will also include temporary street closures, overhead power lines, bridge work, utility work, and bike lane installation.

Financial Report given by Tim Backora and approved by Council. March monthly expenses were \$99,000 and income was \$73,000.

Staff reports given and approved by Council. A question was raised regarding KMLC participation in events such

as parades or other gatherings. After much discussion, Social Ministry agreed to follow up and report back to the council. Pastor Hall noted that there are available forum times should any of the ministry clusters wish to hold a presentation. Pastor Duminy reported that the youth trip to New Orleans is July 14-21. The youth are continuing to fundraise to offset the costs associated with traveling, lodging, meals, and attending the youth gathering in New Orleans. They are still \$10,000 short of their fundraising goal.

Committee and Board reports given and approved by Council.

Faith Formation Ministry: Youth fundraising for Youth Gathering.

Membership Ministry: Upcoming new member class. Archives working on the 165th year project.

Community Engagement Ministry: Global Mission reported Jonna Hollard led alternative gifts for the past 20 years and is looking to pass-the-torch. KCCOC presented an 11th member of the Board, motion and unanimous approval of the addition of Christy Ross as the 11th member.

Worship and Music Ministry: Worship and Music presented the possibility for dedicated giving.

Finance Ministry: Scholarship committee submitted scholarship recommendations, motion and unanimous approval of the scholarships as recommended. The Endowment Board meets on April 29.

Property Ministry: Property reported A/C unit for church office needs to be replaced and cost is estimated at \$23,874. Motion and unanimous approval to proceed with the A/C unit replacement and submission of a grant request to the Endowment Board.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:55 PM.



KMLC Book Group Sunday, June 9 12:15 PM Fellowship Lounge Hang the Moon by Jeanette Walls




Jeannette Walls is the author of her memoir, *The Glass Castle*, and story of her grandmother, *Half Broke Horses*. *Hang the Moon* is a historical fiction set in Virginia during the Prohibition of the 1920's.

> Sallie Kincaid is the main character who is the daughter of Duke Kincaid, the most important man in Caywood, Virginia, and controls the business of Claiborne County. Sallie's mother died when she was 3 years old and Duke remarried, Jane, and a son, Eddie, was born to this union. Sallie was a strong person

and tried to make Eddie stronger. Following an accident that injured 3-yearold Eddie when Sallie was 8, she was banished to live with her aunt Faye, her mother's sister in Hatfield. Nine years later, Sallie returns home following the death of her stepmother. She tries to regain her position in the family. Sallie is a fiesty, sharp witted protagonist and eventually inherits everything after overcoming many heartaches. She single handedly meets the challenges and responsibilities to carry on the family business and navigates the bootlegging business to help the county survive the times.

The novel contains descriptions of physical assault, domestic abuse, suicide, murder, and racism. Themes of story are memory of the past, dysfunctional family and secrets, fear of commitment, loss, loneliness, and guilt.

Sunday, July 14 *Hors*e by Geraldine Brooks



Horse is based on a true story of Lexington, America's most famous race horse. Geraldine Brooks is a Pulitzer Prize winning author who skillfully brings the past to life and writes a compelling story of American history.

The novel begins in Washington D.C. in 2019 where characters, Theo and Jess are introduced. Theo is a Nigerian American art historian who discovers an old painting of a horse in a box of belongings discarded by his neighbor. Jess is a native Australian scientist at the Smithsonian who is studying

the skeleton of a horse that has been found in an attic. These two characters are brought together in their interest in finding the history of this horse. The story then goes to 1850 Lexington, Kentucky, where Jarret, a slave boy, serves as a horse groomsman and bonds with a bay foal. During this period, Thomas J. Scott, an artist, paints paintings of horses, and discovers Lexington and Jarret.


