It's (almost) September – one of those times of year when it feels like time is racing forward, and there is more to do each day than I can possibly accomplish. **As a mom, a pastor, and just a human being, I can find this time of year exhausting!** While I am grateful for the routines and activities that rev back up... **it's a lot**. And I suspect I'm not the only one feeling that way at the moment.

So, as I sit here – hastily trying to get my Good News article written, right up to the deadline – I am remembering the advice a spiritual mentor gave me many years ago. She was speaking specifically about worship but it applies to much of life in general: **focus on ONE thing**. Find the one thing that God is saying to you in that hour; the one thing you need to do next; the one thing that is most important today. Just ONE thing.

If I am being honest, it goes a little against my instinct to share this with you. It's tempting to ask you to do MORE, just as I'm tempted to try and figure out how I can do more. Because I see just how much there is to do together here at Kountze! We need your gifts and talents; we need people to volunteer in our different ministries, mentors to guide our youth, new energy and ideas to reimagine ministry with our college and young professionals, ushers, communion servers, acolytes, folks to visit our homebound... but none

of us can do it all, or even most of it. Each of us must work hard to discern what is that ONE thing God might be calling us to. And when each of us offers our gifts, and guards our own hearts, minds and bodies from doing too much – together, we are the body of Christ.

The exciting, hopeful, energizing news is that God is present and leading us here at Kountze and there is good work ahead of us. There is a sense of mission that fills me with joy. We need every person and their gifts in this mission. AND, it's okay to say no to some things in order to say yes to the one thing that is truly what God is inviting you into in this season. So (as I preach to myself here) I invite you today to ask God what that ONE thing is for you. And most of all, I urge you to remember that NOTHING we do can earn what God has freely, lavishly given us: our belovedness and worth. Sit for a moment with that ONE truth - even if you don't get out of bed tomorrow... even if you drop all the balls you're trying to juggle... even if you're not able to be supermom/ superman/superfriend/superhuman - you are beloved Child of God. And that is enough.

NEWS & Notes...



July 16, 2024

Pastor Wynard called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. The agenda was adopted and previous minutes approved. **Old Business.** Council discussed the Associate Pastor position by reflecting

- what has gone well (fellowship, youth, coming out of pandemic, breakfast, visitation, connections with people, and lots of responsibilities),
- what do we wish we had more time on (hire began during pandemic which was difficult, more time with Senior Pastor, and more communication with Council to lighten the load),
- and what we hope for the next season (staffing needs, assignment of roles, expectations, process, and clarification).

Council retreat is set for Saturday, September 14, 2024

along with a Friday evening meal. Mary Lee Brock will preside over the retreat as we develop our next steps. Tina & Jerry have volunteered to oversee the retreat. Ministry Fairs to be held on August 4 & August 25. Katie Larson will visit on August 11. Servant Keeper to Realm software process has begun. The 2024 financials will still be completed using Servant Keeper. Church staff consultation will be this fall with Martin Malley.

New Business. Congregational meeting to be held on August 18. Agenda is Transition team update, KCCOC vote, Council & Endowment elections, and unspent funds presentation. Council approved nominees Jenn Bunge and Ruth Henneman for Church council and Mike Jensen for Endowment Board. Jill Conway will present on KCCOC, and Mike Jensen will present on the unspent funds plan.

Financial Report given by Tim Backora. June giving was down (typical for the summer months) and expenses were level. June overall was \$33,000 in the red.

Staff reports given and approved by Council. Ministry, Committee, and Board reports given and approved by Council.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Update from the Transition Team

The Pastoral Transition Team has continued to meet this summer conducting the necessary research and collecting information to begin the Pastoral Call process for a new Associate Pastor. The ELCA process requires that we complete a Ministry Site Profile (MSP) specific to our needs, while also sharing information about Kountze with potential candidates. Some requested information is statistical (active members, number of baptisms, number of confirmations, etc.) but other information requires self-evaluation,



summarizing congregational characteristics, and collecting input from members (like the surveys you responded to in June & August). The Transition Team are eager to both hear your input and share what we are discussing and working on! Please be in conversation with us in this stage of the process.

Once we finalize a draft of the MSP it will be submitted for Council review, and the final form will be available to the congregation this fall. We hope to finish this stage of the process by the end of October. From there, the MSP will officially be posted through the Nebraska Synod office and a Pastoral Call Committee will be formed. The Call Committee will consist of some members of the Transition Team as well as other congregants - again, with the goal of representing as much of the diversity of our congregation as possible without having too big of a group! The Call Committee will be responsible for evaluating potential candidates' paperwork, which the Synod will pass on to us, and interviewing appropriate candidates. Because of the importance of confidentiality around specific candidates, the Call Committee will be able to share very little detail about their work. The MSP and the Holy Spirit will guide their discernment.

In the meantime, the Nebraska Synod has been working with us to identify interim support for Kountze Memorial. Transparently - there is a lack of available Transitional Ministers in the Synod. But we have been assured this does NOT mean there is a shortage of candidates for our next Associate Pastor. In fact, the Synod is confident that when we get to that stage we will have candidates to interview. Pastor Lucy is in conversation with a potential part-time Interim Minister about our needs and how they might help.

Please keep praying for the Transition Team, our amazing staff, the Synod and our shared mission, and for the next Associate Pastor as God leads their discernment process. Thank you for your continued support as we prepare for the next phase of Kountze Memorial's special legacy.



World of Wonders - In praise of fireflies, whale sharks, and other astonishments - **bv Aimee Nezhukumatathil**




This is indeed a book of wonders. The author is a poet and educator, professor of English and creative writing at the University of Mississippi. Through her poetic prose and the beautiful illustrations by Fumi Mini Nakamura, the book of essays about nature leads the reader to open his eyes ro see what surrounds us and love the creatures of our planet.


The author reflects on memories of her life from childhood, education, career, and uses creatures of nature to help her understand her life. One reviewer suggests to begin reading the book with the last essay on fireflies to set a tone to slow down and be like a child and delight in all that surrounds us from above and below, and recognize how the plants, birds, and animals of our planet interconnect with humans.

This nonfiction book focuses on whale sharks, touch-me-nots, dancing frogs, axolotl, octopuses, comb jelly, and nature, in motherhood, family, childhood, passage of time, and love. It was listed as one of the best books of 2020 by NPR.
