Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church





Caring for the Community Kountze Commons' Annual Health Fair




Outreach Center. The morning was a successful and collaborative effort by the KCCOC partners to promote community health and well-being. The Health Fair and Pantry drew many guests and volunteers. There were over 400 households represented with 31 new guests attending the Pantry and Health Fair.

Pantry and community guests had access to flu vaccines, head and neck cancer screenings, skin cancer screenings, vital signs and glucose checks, healthy eating tips with yummy humus samples from registered dieticians, tips on quitting smoking, CPR education, tips on spotting the signs of a stroke or heart attack, and education on fall prevention and exercise.

KETV Newswatch 7 featured the Health Fair in their morning news in an interview with Alicia Whitehill RN with Nebraska Methodist College. Whitehill is a community clinical coordinator for the school. "[The Health Fair is so important in trying to meet people where they are. Right now, individuals are facing food insecurity and housing insecurity more than ever. It is really important as healthcare providers that we go out into the community and offer our services," Whitehill said during the interview. "The more we learn about social determinants of health the more we recognize that our health is impacted far more outside the walls of a clinic or a hospital."

Overall, the Health Fair offered numerous benefits to both individuals and the community as a whole, including increased access to healthcare, a head start on preventive care, health education, and community building in an effort to reduce health disparities in society. It was truly a day to Feed the Hungry, Heal the Sick, and Tend the Soul.

NEWS & Notes...



Quorum reached and meeting called to order by Pastor Wynard at 6:05 PM

Meeting agenda accepted by acclamation and minutes of the previous meeting approved.

Old Business

The Council discussed the August Congregational Election Meeting held during Forum on the previous Sunday, including financial update. Consensus that good questions were asked, and that the financial update was appreciated and well received.

Council then discussed the ministry fairs that were held in August and what would be appropriate follow-up steps. Pastor Wynard suggested developing a "time and talent sheet" for distribution to members. It was agreed that it would be beneficial to pair this effort with the forthcoming stewardship campaign in order to foster more involvement. A tentative date for stewardship/time and talent presentation was set for the October 6 Forum.

We next discussed the Associate Pastor transition process. Pastor Lucy will meet with someone suggested by the Synod tomorrow to consider possible avenues for a part-time, temporary position to cover some ministry/pastoral care needs (possibilities: visiting to homebound, youth activities, others to be determined). A special focus of the discussion was on keeping momentum in youth activities. It was clarified that anyone stepping into such a temporary position would not be considered for the permanent position. The transition team is doing well and making progress toward completion of their work.

Pastor Wynard announced that a Staffing Consultation with Martin Malley has been scheduled, and that the church office has begun using the Realm Church Management Software.

New Business

Robust discussion of ideas for the New Member class, including involvement of outreach committee (callers of new members) and/or council members at new member

class. These members of the congregation could help new members feel welcomed, lead tours of the building, etc. The next new member classes will be held on September 15 and 29 (intervening Sunday is Church Picnic). Call for 1-2 council members and an outreach person to attend along with the new members and Pastor Hall. Lara volunteered for both dates, and Anne Dey for September 29. Person from New Member Outreach still sought.

Pastor Lucy asked all members to think about their committee assignments & leadership needs for upcoming year. Will need to rethink some liaison positions as some members rotate off council. Tina has volunteered to serve as president, and Tim has agreed to stay on as treasurer. We also need to get 1-2 additional council members registered as check-signers, as some are rotating off of council and some are likely to be out of town on a regular basis. There was unanimous expression of thanks and farewell to outgoing Council members.

This year's Council Retreat will be held on Saturday, September 14, with the usual Dinner for council members, (new, current, and returning), staff, and their families on Friday, September 13. As incoming President, Tina will coordinate the dinner.

Financial Report

Tim reported that expenses ran approximately \$5,000 over income this month, with net income at -\$4,600; Year-to-date we are at -\$47,000, (compared to-\$15,000 at this time one year ago). Overall income is about the same as last year at this time, and discrepancy in the year-to-date numbers compared to last year is attributable to the salary for KCCOC director being paid monthly by the church , while transfer of funds from KCCOC to the church toward these payments happens on a less frequent schedule and has not yet occurred in the current cycle. No major financial concerns, but we need to increase bottom line giving. Finance report accepted by unanimous consent.

Staff reports given and approved by Council.

Ministry, Committee, and Board reports given and approved by Council.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer and adjournment at 7:21PM.



The month of Reformation invites us to not just consider how God might be calling us to be formed and reformed, but also to ponder how God might be inviting us to cultivate grace. Paul writes, "For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption of Christ Jesus" (Romans 3:22-24, NRSV). Grace is a gift of God that we cannot earn or ever deserve, but that is given freely. It embodies the gifts of life and salvation which are pure gifts too. As we continue to cultivate love, God might also be inviting us cultivate grace through reconciliation and continued community connections. What could this look like in your context?

Questions for Reflection:

- In what ways have you seen and experienced God's grace made real for you?
- How might we, be being invited to cultivate grace? What might this look and feel like?
- How might God be inviting us to cultivate grace through reconciliation and continued community connections (especially in a month leading up to an election)?
- "Cultivating Grace" obviously connects with Reformation Day. But in what other ways might it connect with some of the core practices, values, and understandings of who we are as God's people.
- The October calendar includes Harvest time, Indigenous Peoples Day, Domestic Violence Awareness Month, the Nebraska Synod Fall Leadership Gathering, and Reformation. What ways might we cultivate grace through these dates and observances?
