EPIPHANY of OUR LORD

SECOND READING Ephesians 3:1-12

What had been hidden from previous generations is now made known through the gospel ministry of Paul and others. In Christ both Jews and Gentiles participate in the richness of God's promised salvation.

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—²for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, ³and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

⁷Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. ⁸Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; ¹⁰so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

PRAYERS AND BLESSING

A Prayer for the Week:

Dear God, our hearts sing with gladness for your grace and truth that blesses us each day through Jesus, the Word that became flesh and lives among us now. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

God of abundant love, we thank you for the gift of this food, a reminder of your care for us each and every day through Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

Child of God, may the light of Jesus shine in your heart.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- When is a time you remember being afraid of the dark?
- Jesus Christ is the light of the world. How does knowing this help you when you are in a dark place?

DEVOTIONS

Read: John 1:1-18.

From the beginning of his Gospel, John wants us to know that "the Word became flesh and lived among us" (v. 14). John's Gospel will guide us to trust that Jesus Christ is the Word of God that has come to bring light into our darkest days and hope for the world that God loves so much. Our darkest days might be the lingering grief over the death of a loved one or a relationship that needs healing. During such moments, what we need most is God's grace that accepts us, God's light that shatters darkness, and God's truth that heals relationships. As children of God, we believe that God's only Son has entered our world and our lives to conquer all the darkness that separates us from the love of God. The true light that came into the world shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overtake it. Thanks be to God for this good, good news.

Discuss: Where do you hope for God's healing power over darkness in the world? in your life?

Pray: Gracious God, you turn our sadness into joy; may we remember that you are present in our lives to give us hope, peace, and compassion through Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible readings and theme for this week, how can you share Jesus' light with someone who is in a dark place?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

In Ephesians 1:5, the apostle Paul tells us that before creation began, God "destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ." Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, we have been adopted as God's children. Design an "Adoption Certificate" that includes your name and these words: (name) is an adopted child of God through Jesus Christ. Draw a dove on the certificate to symbolize the Holy Spirit. You could also include your baptismal dates and a picture. Place the certificate in a place you walk by each day as a reminder of God's love for you.
