**April is a wonderful month** – spring is here, Easter is just around the corner, some of us are making fun plans for summer, and we can feel our spirits lifting as the days get longer and the weather warmer. I know we still have a few weeks of our Lenten journey to go – but my head and heart are jumping ahead to the promise of Easter. Spring and Easter are reminders that there is new life, resurrection, even in the here and now of our sometimes broken and hurting world. This has been a hard winter for some – at Kountze we lost a number of our beloved saints in the last 6 months, and the storms though few, were harsh and disruptive. I'm ready for some newness, some new life, some light, and warmth!

As we round the corner to spring and the Easter season, we also anticipate new things in our congregation. We've recently hired a new Executive Director for Kountze Commons, and we hope to welcome a new Associate to the pastoral team very soon. We have new partnerships with Omaha Bridges and Together, helping our community members gain important skills to climb out of poverty and find affordable housing. Our old, old building is in a constant state of being repaired and renewed, and we are looking at putting in a columbarium and rededicating the chapel space on the east corner.

Every Easter season I am reminded, though, that newness and resurrection do not always, or even often, feel comfortable, natural, easy. Exciting, yes! But easy and comfortable? Nope! As we welcome new folks to the Kountze community – new staff, new members, new community partners – and as we watch things change around us, from the streetcar project to our own steady but regular changes in the building and programs, it can be easy to forget that. So here is a gentle reminder: discomfort and pain are not always a sign that something is wrong, just that something is new.

Change is hard. New parents know this, anyone who has switched jobs or moved to a new house knows this, and kids who have just gotten used to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and now have to move on to 4<sup>th</sup> know this! So be gentle on yourself and on others. And as a church community, let's be grace-filled, patient, and hopeful with one another. There are exciting things afoot! There is new life and new mission just around the corner – and that will sometimes feel thrilling, and sometimes very disorienting. Each step of the way God is with us, God is making all things news, and God can be trusted. Remember as we finish our Lenten season of Unbroken: A Living Faith, that there is an unbroken cord of God's faithfulness and grace that stays the same, even as new things happen all around us. And so let new life break forth!

# Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

# NEWS & Notes...



Pastor Wynard called the meeting to order at 6:10 PM via Zoom. Jennifer Bunge led the devotions, "Trust the Process, Trust God's Plan," followed by prayer led by Pastor Wynard.

The agenda and January minutes were approved as presented.

Tim Bakora reported that Noni is working diligently to get the income and expenses recorded in the appropriate categories using the new accounting software, Realm. This is a very time-consuming process. He reported that January 2025 was an excellent month for donations. Donations to the General Fund were over \$115,000, and expenses were approximately \$75,000. The donation to the Synod was not submitted in January; however, it will be submitted with the February donation.

Training for the staff and key leaders on the Realm accounting system will begin soon.

#### **Old Business:**

Pastor Wynard reported that the Call Committee has met. Tarna Kidder is leading the Call Committee and doing an excellent job. Pastor Wynard provided an update on the Call process.

#### **New Bsiness:**

Kountze Commons. Pastor Wynard reported that Joyce Palmer resigned as the Healing Gift Free Clinic administrator on December 31, 2024. Steve Hinrich reported that the Clinic's Search Committee for Joyce's replacement has hired Mr. Ryan Mahr as the Clinic Administrator with an official start date of February 20, 2025. The Clinic Administrator reports to the executive committee of the Clinic Board.

There was a discussion regarding the sharing of the current office in the Kountze Commons. This space could be configured as a shared office for the Clinic Administrator and the Kountze Commons Executive Director.

Pastor Wynard reported that the Kountze Pantry Director and the Kountze Commons Executive Director have stepped down from their respective roles.

The Love Thy Neighbor Food Pantry recently became a USDA Program facility at the request of the Foodbank for the Heartland. The search for the Love Thy Neighbor Food Pantry Director has not started yet as a job description is being developed as more clarification on some of the training requirements and multiple other requirements of

the USDA Program are received. At this point, things seem very overwhelming and confusing.

Tim Backora pointed out that it is very likely that because of the multiple requirements and extensive record keeping the director position may potentially require several hours per week and may need to be a paid position.

Pastor Lucy reported that the Pantry Board will meet with the San Andreas Food Pantry representatives to discuss their experiences running a USDA Program member food pantry. That meeting was scheduled for this week but was canceled due to the inclement weather. There is also the possibility that the Kountze Commons Executive Director may be able to help with some of the pantry administration.

Ruth Hennemann reported that two applications have been received for the Kountze Commons Executive Director and that interviews are being scheduled. Some of the administrative responsibilities of the Love Thy Neighbor Food Pantry are being considered as a part of the job description for the Executive Director.

Tim Backora and Pastor Wynard reported that both designated and undesignated memorial funds sometimes are not applied in a manner that was the family's (families) wishes at the time of the bequest. It was suggested that a specific committee be formed to remedy this issue. The Committee would work to ensure the donor's requests are followed, that letters would be sent to the families documenting what was being done with the donations, and to acknowledge such gifts.

Tim Backora moved, and it was seconded, that the Council establish a Memorial Committee to ensure that both designated and undesignated memorial funds to the church are being used per the donors'/families' wishes and to document how these designated and undesignated memorial funds are used. Following discussion, the motion was carried.

Three Council members agreed to serve on this committee. They are Tina Broeckemeier, Bruce Nissen, and Ruth Henneman.

#### **Staff Reports:**

Staff reports were accepted as presented.

#### **Committee and Board Reports:**

Pastor Wynard reported that there are eleven members in the current confirmation class. A winter retreat was held for the entire group of confirmation students.

Toby has been a long-term member of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. Toby and her husband, Eric, were married in the church and also baptized all three of their children, Dannika, Lawton, and Braxton at Kountze. Toby participates and assists in Sunday School, the breakfast mission, and Circle.

Toby is active in the swimming world and volunteers as a swimming official. In her free time she enjoys gardening, running, and scrapbooking.

> Kristin Hannah is the best selling author of more than 20 novels. *The Women* was in the process of writing for decades and published in 2024. The Vietnam War was a dangerous

time in our country, and Hannah was inspired by the stories of the women who served during that time. Their stories were overlooked and forgotten and Hannah wanted to recognize the women for their heroic deeds.

The main character, Frances, "Frankie", Mc Grath, was a 20 year old nursing student when she heard the phrase,"women can be heroes". After her brother was sent to Vietnam, she decided to join the Army Nurse Corps, and was assigned to duty in Vietnam. She put her life in harm's way and endured the pain of war to make a commitment to her country which was forgotten. The battle for Vietnam veterans continued when they returned home to a country who mistreated them. The novel describes an era of a divided nation and how deep friendships and patriotism formed under fire were forgotten. It is an account of the many women who were in Vietnam.


