



ADORATION OF THE CROSS AND PRAYERS AT THE ALTAR

The tradition of venerating or adoring the cross dates back to the fourth century. Today, Christians around the world, especially during Holy Week, bow, kneel, or light candles before the cross as an expression of reverence for Christ's sacrifice and a sign of devotion to the living Christ present among us. In our Lenten services, you are invited to come forward, kneel or bow before the cross, and light a candle as a prayerful act of reflection and faith.


