Who are the "Welcome Team" -The Most Important Team at Church??

A couple years ago I read an article that has stuck with me. It was in the ELCA magazine Living Lutheran and was called "The Search for a Church". Written by a retired pastor, Kathryn Haueisen, the author found herself, for the first time in many, many years, searching for a church where she could belong - and finding it a more bewildering, uncomfortable process than she remembered it could be! I thought about the article again this past Sunday as I chatted after worship with a few first-time visitors, new to our city, and looking for a church. I think it's easy to forget how much courage it takes to walk through the doors of a new-to-you congregation – and how different and alien it can feel, even if you've gone to an ELCA church your whole life.

Haueisen shares in her article that her whole experience visiting churches taught her some things about the best ways to make people truly feel welcome when they walk through our doors. And about some things to avoid. We think friendliness is most important, but she describes a few times when people were very friendly but

the communication about what was happening and where and when was unclear - and she was left feeling awkward and exposed despite the friendliness. So good, clear signage and communication is vital! I try to read our bulletins, newsletters, website, and Facebook page with the eyes of a visitor: what information are newcomers most likely to search for and can they find it easily? When someone who has never worshipped with us before joins us on a Sunday, does the bulletin and the instructions from the front make it easy for them to know what to do when when to stand and sit, how to receive communion, where to find the bathrooms, nursery, etc.?

One step we'd like to take towards being even more

welcoming than we already are is to form a "Welcome **Team" on Sunday mornings.** The Welcome Team are there to look out for folks who might be new, to be ready to answer those practical questions like "Where are the bathrooms?" or "Where is that sign-up sheet the pastor mentioned?" ... Who would serve on such a team? ALL of us! Why? Because welcome is a job that belongs to us all! Haueisen identifies two really key roles that are essential to making people feel welcomed - roles that any of us can do: spotters and scooters. Spotters are just always on the lookout for someone who looks like they might be new and maybe doesn't have anyone to talk to or greet them. Here are some ways to initiate that won't get you in trouble if it turns out the person you're talking to has been here for years: "Hi, I'm not sure I've met you - my name is _____." What's the next thing to say after they

> tell you their name? You might try, "I know I don't know everybody - have you been here before?" or "Tell me a little about yourself, if you don't mind." Scooters are people who physically move - scoot over- to visually cue somebody looking for a spot to sit that they would welcome them choosing the spot next to them.

All of us can be spotters and scooters. All of us belong on the "Welcome Team". Not to pounce on every newcomer who walks through the door – that can be as intimidating and off-putting as no one talking to you! But just to make sure that we're a place where no one leaves feeling like their presence wasn't noticed, and where everyone feels like they could figure out the rituals and routines of this place easily enough to fit in. So I hope you won't mind being volun-told – but you've just been commissioned to join our Welcome Team. What role you can play in making all feel welcome here?

You already do this well, Kountze Memorial. Countless people have said it to me and I notice it all the time - you

Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church



NEWS & Notes...



Pastor Wynard called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. Pastor Lucy requested that signing onto "nonprofit organization sign-on letter" be added to the agenda under new business. The agenda was accepted as amended.

The following corrections were made to the June 17, 20205 minutes: (1) Under Council Retreat: Line 6 change "Synod Council" to "Synod Assembly"; (2) Under Questions/Concerns/Comments: under NIL Lutheran second paragraph Line 6 change "which complicates" to "which requires strategies for..."; and (3) remove Jerry Fischer from the list of those present. The minutes of the June meeting were accepted as corrected.

Tim Backora reported that total income for the month of June was just over \$61,500. Last June it was just under \$55,000. The year-to-date balance is \$5,900. Typically, summer revenue is down. Financially, the church is doing well but not great.

The MIF building loan balance is currently \$704,000. Kountze received an IRA account from the estate of Bobby Powell. These funds are currently in an undesignated Memorial Fund.

The Financial Report was accepted as presented.

Old Business

Associate Minister - There was discussion related to the Call Committees' recommendation to call Deacon Eric Haitz as the Associate Minister for Kountze. The areas of focus for Deacon Haitz in his role as Associate Minister are: Youth and young adults; developing young adult ministries; spiritual formation; share in both preaching and pastoral care; outreach; and building a sense of community. After interviewing him, the Council and the Pastors believe that he has the qualifications to fulfill a majority of these areas. Tim Backora confirmed that the current budget includes monies to support this position. In addition to this position, a part-time Youth Director is also being sought. The Council unanimously voted to recommend to the congregation that we call Deacon Haitz as the next Associate Minister at Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. Pastor Wynard will move forward with making the arrangements for his visit.

The timeline for Deacon Haitz's introduction to the congregation would be to invite him to preach on August 9 and 10 and to be introduced at the Forum on August 10 for a Q&A session. A vote would be taken on August 17 at the congregational meeting, .

2025 Fall Council Retreat – The 2025 Fall Council Retreat is scheduled for October 3 and 4. Pastor Wynard will invite some of the program staff and possibly some of the key committee chairs who are not part of the Council to attend the retreat.

Nominating Committee – The Nominating Committee met and has received confirmation from the following individuals that they will be on the ballot as Council Members for the upcoming election: Marsha Vance, Leon Valquier, and Jacque Johnson.

Memorials Committee – The mission statement drafted by Pastor Wynard and Tim Backora for the Memorials Committee was reviewed and discussed. It was suggested that a brief definition of what a Memorial is be added to the mission statement and that a clause be added at the end of the second sentence that reads "...distribution of designated memorials in accordance with the Council's consensus and our constitution". There was also discussion regarding how memorials are received - undesignated and designated. There will be a total of seven members appointed to the Memorials Committee.

Youth Director Search – The Youth Director position has been posted on INDEED, LinkedIn, and in the church bulletin.

New Business

Non-Profit Organization Sign-on Letter – Information was shared related to a legal settlement related to a landmark case on nonprofit nonpartisanship. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and National Religious Broadcasters, along with two churches in Texas, last week urged a federal court judge to approve a legal settlement between the parties in a landmark case on nonprofit nonpartisanship. This settlement agreement, proposed by the IRS and NRB would declare the Johnson Amendment unconstitutional. The pastors will sign on to the letter to the Trump Administration urging them to uphold the Johnson Amendment (on behalf of the Council).

Staff Reports – The staff reports were accepted as reported.

Committee & Boards Reports – Reports accepted as given.

The next meeting will be held on August 19, 2025. The meeting adjourned at 7:25 PM with the Lord's Prayer.





Recipes for Pantry Guests

Sometimes the Food Bank for the Heartland provides items that may be new to our pantry guests. A few weeks ago, spaghetti squash was on the list—and many weren't sure how to prepare it. Thankfully, "Chef" Jim Smejkal stepped in with a delicious recipe and a cooking demo! Guests were able to



take home the recipe along with all the ingredients needed to try it for themselves.

Jim's Spaghetti Squash

Spaghetti Squash Tomato Sauce Seasoning Packet Salt & Pepper

- 1. Wash the spaghetti squash and cut in half. Use a spoon to scoop out seeds.
- 2. Place squash cut side down in a microwave safe dish and add enough water to cover the bottom of the baking dish (approximately 1 inch). Cover with plastic wrap and cook on high for 5 minutes. Squash is cooked when it is tender to the touch. Use caution when touching as the squash will be hot. Microwave another 5 minutes if needed.
- 3. Allow squash to cool. Once cool, use a fork to scrape out the strands of squash into a bowl.
- 4. Mix tomato sauce, Italian seasoning packet, salt and pepper together. Pour on squash strands.
- 5. Microwave 1 to 2 minutes.
- 6. Serve and enjoy!
