



This letter written to Timothy is a personal message of encouragement. In the face of hardship and persecution, Timothy is reminded that his faith is a gift of God. He is encouraged to exercise that faith with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus.

² To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

³ I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴ Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵ I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. ⁶ For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands, ⁷ for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

⁸ Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, in the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace, and this grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹ For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹² and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day the deposit I have entrusted to him. ¹³ Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Guard the good deposit entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.







THE DISTRIBUTION

All baptized Christians who confess Jesus Christ as Lord and his Real Presence in, with and under the bread and wine, are welcome to the Lord's Supper. We believe that this is the Lord's table and is he who invites you. So you who are strong in faith, come with gratitude. You who feel weak in faith, come to be strengthened. And you who feel you have no faith, come so that the God of steadfast love will touch your heart with hope and joy. The form of distribution is intinction: you will receive the consecrated bread and then you may dip the bread into the wine. Gluten free bread is available upon request. If you cannot or choose not to receive the wine, know that the sacrament and God's promised forgiveness are complete in either element.

DEVOTIONS

Read: Luke 17:1-10.

Jesus is teaching his disciples—and us—to trust him, lean on him, and to be content in our daily lives. We, like Jesus' disciples in this reading, can and will continue to miss the point of faith. Earlier in Luke 14:26-27, Jesus set a very high bar for his followers: putting Jesus above family, wealth, and even personal security. In Luke 17:1-4, he says one needs to forgive when asked, and one should not cause another to sin. No wonder his followers ask for their faith to be increased! And yet, the request misses the point. Any amount of faith will do. Faith is not a quantity that can be measured. Faith, large or small, does not give one a reward. It is a way of life where followers of Jesus learn and grow as they live out their faith, make mistakes and learn from those mistakes. As they learn, they will rely more on Jesus than on their own powers. In a world that many times abuses the humble and needy, the life of faith seeks to live with compassion, generosity, and hope.

Discuss: How does your faith guide your daily living?

Pray: Almighty God, help us to trust in you, learn from you, and continue to turn to you as the source of all that is good and worthy in life through Jesus Christ. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you encourage someone who is experiencing discouragement?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Paul encouraged Timothy to rekindle the gift God had given to him (2 Timothy 1:6). God has given each of us gifts to use and develop. Think or talk about what gifts God has given you and others you know. Write each of these on sticky notes. Stick the notes in a visible location as a reminder of the various gifts God has given us to serve others.

Pray: Lord, help us to rekindle the gifts you have given us and seek places where we can use them to serve others. Amen.
