Last Sunday (November 16, in real time), I talked about December as that time of year when the world is almost aggressively cheerful and bright, and the church, observing Advent, is trying its best to hold together the tension – acknowledging the pain & brokenness of the world and our need for a Savior, and proclaiming the hope that God is near.

It may seem, at first glance, that our Advent theme this year leans more into that aggressive cheeriness and less into the tension and quiet waiting of Advent. But I think as we journey together this December we'll discover that "The Power of YES" can help us navigate two different realities: the holy longing of Advent and the frenzy of commercialized Christmas. In a world that seems increasingly full of conflict, and where our choices – about how we spend our time, where we spend our money, who and what we put our trust in –

are all increasingly under scrutiny, it can feel like we don't have much power to change those big forces in culture. We are simply at the mercy of the relentless currents around us. But "The Power of YES" invites us to learn from our ancestors in the faith.

The cast of characters in this Advent and Christmas story weren't power brokers and culture makers, at least not at first glance. They were simple people very much at the mercy of the powerful in their own turbulent, topsy-turvy time. But God invited them to a risky YES to God's plan. And, even without knowing all the details, they said yes to God. We come from a history of simple, faithful people who said yes. Through their acts of faith, God came near, and the world was forever transformed.

How do we discern what YES God might be inviting us to? What does it take to get to that YES? Why does it even matter that we believe? The story of Advent and Christmas is more than sentimental. As people of faith, it's a story that lives in our bones and invites us into what God is doing in our world today. It calls us to our own YES, and to the risks and rewards that come with it. It invites us to the manger – and to the awe, the sorrow, and the joy we find there. So join us – and invite a friend – to explore "The Power of YES" this Advent and Christmas season.

# **New Altar Flowers, Eternal Candle, TV Broadcast Charts**


The 2026 charts are up in the Narthex on the bulletin board. Be sure to sign up for your date(s) before they're gone.

### **Financial Report:**

Expenses were \$85,000 with \$65,000 earned bringing the year to date as -\$35,000. This is better than we were last year this time and we expect to be in black by the end of year. Requests for the budgets for next year by late November/early December. This will allow for Tim and Marsha to have time to look them over and possibly have a budget at the end of December/early Jan.

#### Old Business:

Council meeting the 21st and 22nd emails to follow up. Youth director position taken by Sheila Valquier. Discussion was had on how to engage the youth. Currently we are opting for less formal events to encourage camaraderie as well as planning more diverse things. Progressive dinners have been working well and if you have the space and or time to help it would be appreciated.

For young adults there was a discussion among some volunteers on how to create space and activities encouraging fellowship. Possibly be able to plan a potluck. Discussion then turned to how to encourage spaces for all to have fellowship outside of our usual weekly events.

The stewardship campaign is going well. We still need to find time to train on the Realm software perhaps sometime in Feb as we are in the midst of the holiday season.

The streetcar gas lines have been moving and the Harney street bridge is expected to be done by end of November meaning the Farnam Street bridge is expected to come down in December or January. There has been

confirmation that we will be able to reach the parking lot on Farnam though it may be the farthest that will be open at times.

#### **New Business:**

We had a film company reach out on potential pro-bono work. We would like to use professional photos for our website.

### **Staff Reports:**

Everyone was pleased that we had time to go over the staff reports and no updates regarding them. Committee & Board Reports:

There are concerns with the food pantry with the stoppage of SNAP benefits. Numbers have been going up. With non-green card holders losing benefits after December there are concerns about continued food stresses in our community. Toby is implementing a Halal shelf for our guests that would prefer those options. We are in need of protein cereal and produce.

The endowment board was able to offer table grace 5,000, 10,000 approved for Nile Lutheran kitchen, 11,500 for global mission and 4,500 for holy cross.

KETV has been rebranded as Kountze Endowment Real Estate LLC. It is not yet official but it will be what we communicate out as.

The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.


