Christmas Continues...

The Work of Christmas

by Howard Thurman

When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost,

To heal the broken,

To feed the hungry,

To release the prisoner,

To rebuild the nations,

To bring peace among brothers,

To make music in the heart.

Perhaps it's a peculiar reality of my job – but I suspect some of you might relate: About December 26th I am really *ready* to start enjoying the Christmas season! Of course, Christmas as a liturgical calendar season only begins on December 24th & runs a full 12 days until Epiphany, January 6th... but as you and I well know, by January 2nd, at the latest, most of the world has decidedly moved on. For society, it's no longer Christmas once January hits. I feel on the one hand I get to truly live into Advent and Christmas more than the average person, but on the other, that in the very busyness of all the planning, I get almost robbed of the season. Which is why I am so grateful for those 12 days of Christmas. But I have increasingly learned to embrace an even wider, and longer, view of Christmas, taking my cue from neighboring cultures and other corners of our global communion of saints.

For our Mexican siblings, I have learned, Christmas really begins on December 12th with the Feast of the Virgin of

Guadalupe, and stretches until February 2nd, Candlemas. Candlemas is an ancient Christian celebration marking 40 days after Jesus birth and his presentation in the temple, according to Jewish tradition. Luke 2, beginning in verse 22, tells that story – Mary and Joseph bringing the baby Jesus to be consecrated, and the devout elder, Simeon, and prophet, Anna, praising God for the salvation he brings.

What I love is the reminder that the story we condense into short days, sometimes short minutes of reading and retelling, unfolded in real time much like our lives – in significant moments and milestones sandwiched between long days and weeks of regular, busy, everyday holiness. The wise men journeying for weeks, following the star and wondering where it would lead. Mary counting the months as her belly grew. Even the shepherds – how long did it take them to get from that hillside to the manger? What did they talk about on the way? And so I leave my tree up all the way through January and remind myself that these days are filled with the sacred gladness and invitation of

Christmas too. These cold, mundane days are anointed with the promise that God has come, and they invite me to what Howard Thurman describes in his famous poem as “the work of Christmas”. The beauty and magic of the season isn't over – it's simply hidden amongst the tasks and people of each day, ready to be discovered and embraced.

God's incarnation among us continues – Merry Christmas!

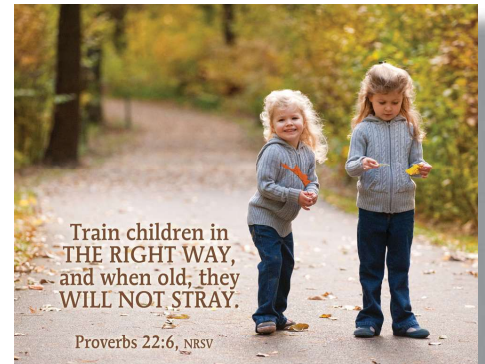

Children in Worship

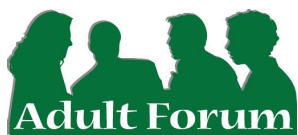

November 18, 2025

Call to Order: 6:04 PM

A motion to accept the agenda as written was made and carried.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Minutes were accepted with the following corrections:

- Tim Backora was not listed as present.
- Kate McCoy was not listed as present.
- Expenses should have been listed as \$80,000, not \$85,000.

Financial Report

- Total income for the month: \$70,000 (compared to \$78,000 last year).
- Last year's high interest income skews the comparison slightly; overall giving trends are consistent.
- Expenses: \$98,000 (compared to \$78,000 last year)
- Maintenance costs increased.
- Compensation increased due to additional staff.
- Net income for the month: -\$28,000.
- Funds at Cambridge: \$1.4 million with solid returns.

Overall, finances are stable, though with some strain. Leadership anticipates remaining in a generally sound financial position.

Old Business

Council Retreat

- Council members are asked to reflect on and list current challenges facing Kountze (large or small).
- Breakfast and lunch are provided.

Stewardship

- Stewardship letters were mailed Monday.
- The Stewardship Team and stuffing-party volunteers were thanked.
- Letters should arrive by the weekend.
- Pastor Lucy will discuss stewardship materials at this Sunday's forum; council members are encouraged to attend.

Streetcar Construction Update

- Harney ramp has reopened; another bridge should reopen soon.
- After that, the Farnam bridge will close.
- Both entrances to the church parking lot are expected to remain open, except for 1-2 brief closures (none on weekends).

New Business

Annual Budget Meeting Planning

- **Budget vote:** February 15
- **Budget presentation** (Finance Committee): February 8
- High-attendance meetings are excellent opportunities to communicate updates, celebrate progress, and highlight staff or ministry transitions.
- **Quarterly updates:** Toby Rees will offer periodic 10-15 minute reports; additional updates may include work by Deacon Eric, Sheila, and Toby.

Staff Reports

A motion to accept staff reports as submitted was made and carried.

The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

Street Car Construction Update for January 2026

Work continues on the street car along Farnam Street. The current schedule calls for:

- the closing of the Farnam Street bridge over I-480 on Monday, January 5.
- I-480 will be closed traffic for bridge demolition on Friday, January 9 at 9 PM. The closure will last until Monday January 12 at 6:00 AM, weather permitting. North bound Traffic will have to exit at the Harney/Dodge exit, South bound traffic will have to exit at 30th Street.

Please watch for detours and allow a little extra time to get to church on Sunday January 11. In the coming months, as construction ramps up, we will do our best to keep you informed.



Epiphany New Year Home Blessing

In German and Scandinavian countries, it is an old Christian custom to bless homes on January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany (or Three Kings Day). The family gathers at the front door, where the year and C + M + B is written over the door or on the door. The letters are initials of the Latin phrase, "May Christ bless this house" (Christus Mansionem Benedicat). However, because the blessing occurs on Epiphany (the last day of Christmas marking the visit of the Magi to Jesus), children are given a small gift (usually candy) and told that the three wise men (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar) visited in the night, signed their initials, and left a present. You can celebrate this blessing yourselves on this festival day to mark the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of a new calendar year, whether you live alone or with a large family.

You can make this blessing as simple or as intricate as you like; including the liturgical greeting (e.g. "The Lord be with you..."), a song or carol, Prayer of the Day for Epiphany, sprinkling the door or each room with water, readings (e.g. Matthew 2:1-12 or the start of

John's Gospel, 1:1-14), Lord's Prayer, and/or incense (frankincense, of course!). The core of the house blessing simply involves taking chalk (of any color) and gathering at the main door. You may write on the door or above the door: 20 + C + M + B + 25. As you do so, you or another may say: "The three Wise Men—Caspar, Melchior, Balthazar—followed the star to God's Son who became human two thousand and twenty-five years ago. Thanks be to God! May Christ bless this home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen." Indeed, may the light of Christ enrich our homes and all the people who dwell within, giving us and the guests who come the light, warmth, and peace of the Holy Trinity, whose love is everlasting!

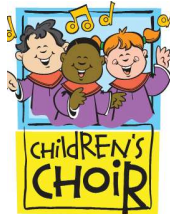

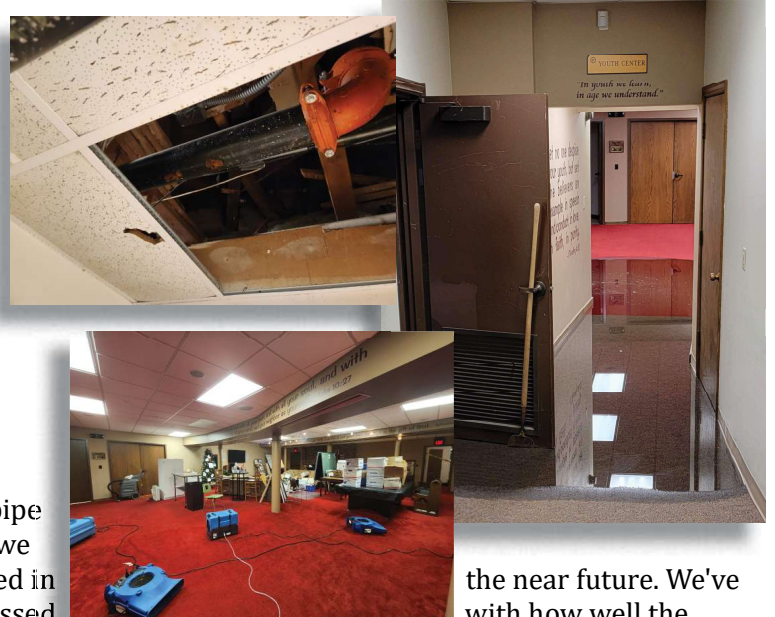

Water Damage

At approximately 2:30 AM on December 14, our fire system alerted that we had a problem - the "dry" side of the system lost air pressure, triggering the water valve to release and quickly causing a flood in the church basement. It turns out two pinholes caused by rust - due, we suspect, to the pipe settling and sloping just slightly in the wrong direction - had finally gotten to the point of not holding enough pressure. Thanks to a combination of luck, quick and smart response by our staff and volunteers, and God's abundant grace, the problem was significantly mitigated. A small team of our folk removed roughly 60 gallons of water before the professionals even got here. ServePro removed another 30+ gallons and set up fans and dehumidifiers for several days. In the end the water damage was limited, the pipe has been fixed (and slopes in the right direction now!), and we will make sure the whole fire suppression system is inspected in spoken with our insurance agent and they were quite impressed situation was handled. We won't be making a claim since it's meet our deductible. HUGE thanks to all who helped so quickly - including those who pitched in Sunday morning to haul things out of the affected rooms and our Council leaders who authorized quick action. A special shout-out to the team who showed up in the wee morning hours - Louis Flake, Jim Smejkal, Jason Klonglan, Tim Backora, Dan Troxel, and Mike Jensen. We are so very grateful for you!
