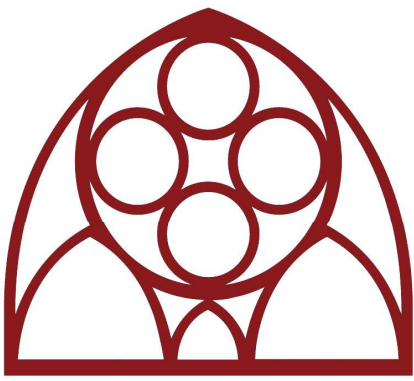

FROM THE PASTOR

I was skeptical of our Vacation Bible School theme at first. You see, this year it was based on Philippians 4:13 – one of the most beautiful and misused verses in the bible! “I can do ALL THINGS through Christ, who gives me strength.” Paul wrote to the church in Philippi while he was imprisoned to thank and encourage them. They too suffered plenty of persecution for their faith, but they were generous in their financial support, in sending missionary companions to Paul, and in their warm affection for him and his ministry.

So when Paul says, “I can do ALL THINGS...” he’s not claiming some of kind of magical get-out-of-jail card – quite the opposite. His is saying that regardless of his circumstances he has learned to lean on the power God gives him, a power that can carry him through anything, that can give him strength, hope and joy even on the hardest days.

I didn’t need to be skeptical as it turned out. The curriculum did a great job emphasizing to our kids that we will face all kinds of things in our lives – but God will be with us every step of the way, and God gives us strength for all of it. This month I’ve seen lots of up-close examples of disciples leaning into that strength. Missionary partners like Rev. Bridget Gautieri joyfully sharing the Good News in the birthplace of the Reformation where, thanks to the long Soviet influence, very few Christians live today. Members of our Kountze community who have lost a loved one in

the last year and bravely bear their grief and loneliness, and turn to their church family for strength. Refugee and immigrant guests of our Pantry and Clinic who keep working as hard as they can to feed their families and make a safe home for themselves in this country, even as

the rules keep shifting and the fear of an unknown future looms large.

And our children, making sense of the world around them and learning through the ups and downs of their own lives – losing beloved pets, getting ready anxiously for the unknowns of a new school year, navigating friendships and peer pressure – that they really can trust God to give them strength. Strength to be brave, to generously share their gifts, to hope for good even when

things don’t go the way they wanted, and to keep talking to God about it all.

We never get so old or mature that we don’t need to keep coming back to these lessons, these bedrock promises. God is with us – and because God is with us, we can do all things, face all things, hold onto hope in the midst of all things, and be brave to share love and hope in all things... through Jesus, the One who has shown us the way.

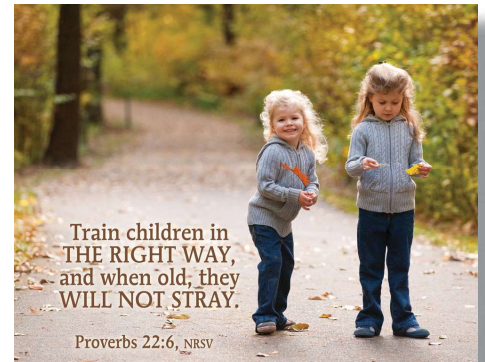

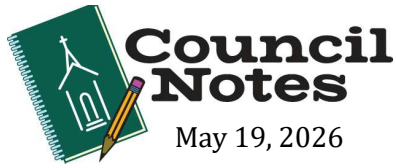

NEWS & Notes...



May 19, 2026

The meeting was called to order: 6:03 PM and adjourned at 7:11 PM.

The agenda was adopted as presented and previous meeting minutes were approved.

The Congregation Council reviewed the church's finances, staffing, property management, ministry partnerships, and several upcoming projects and training opportunities.

The financial report showed that expenses exceeded income during the previous month, due in part to unusually high snow-removal costs. Even so, giving was approximately \$2,000 higher than at the same time last year, and year-to-date finances remained slightly positive. Council also discussed the lower balance in the General Fund and an expense that will be reassigned to the designated Youth Mission Trip account.

Council continued its work to identify candidates for three open Council positions, as well as a new member for the Endowment Board. At least one Council member will also be needed to serve as liaison to the Endowment Board.

A staff retreat is scheduled for June 11. The retreat will focus on clarifying staff responsibilities and identifying areas where additional cross-training would be helpful. Training for the Realm church management system will follow on June 22 and 23. Staff, volunteers, and church leaders will learn more about Realm's financial and database functions.

Work has also begun with NEEMtv on the church's new website. Deacon Eric will oversee social media efforts,

while Debbie will manage website responsibilities. Communications planning will continue to be a collaborative effort.

Interviews are underway for the Pantry Director position, with the hope of filling the position before the next Council meeting. Council also heard that Investors Realty has been selected as the church's new property management company after CBRE announced it would no longer manage the church's properties.

Several ministry updates were shared. The recent Neighborhood Gathering was successful and included strong participation from Pantry guests and residents of deFreese Manor. The Healing Gift Free Clinic is exploring the possibility of establishing an endowment. Plans are also being developed to encourage more young adults to become involved in leadership and ministry opportunities.

Global Mission reported that Nile Lutheran Church is nearing its \$40,000 fundraising goal for kitchen improvements, with approximately \$7,000 still to be raised. Global Mission visitors are scheduled to be with us throughout July. Council also heard positive reports about the recent visit from members of The American Church in Berlin and possible future partnership opportunities involving the Wittenberg Center.

The church's handbells have been refurbished, with the final cost coming in slightly under budget. As the choir concludes its season, anyone interested in providing special music during the summer is encouraged to contact Barb Carlson.

Stewardship planning is underway, with new ideas being discussed and additional committee members being recruited. Council is also considering future events connected with the 10th anniversary of the Kountze Commons building, including a possible gala and an open-house-style "Steeple Tour" with neighboring churches.

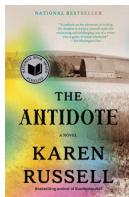

The Antidote by Karen Russell



The Antidote is a magical, historical fiction novel that focuses on memories, forgetting, national injustice, and the legacy of American history. It is set in a fictional town of Uz, Nebraska, in the 1930's.

At the beginning of the novel, Black Sunday, April 14, 1935, occurs. The sky is blotted by a dense black cloud of dust that causes the residents to succumb to suffocation and dust pneumonia. One month later, another disaster strikes when the Republican River flooded after 24 inches of rain in one day.

The Antidote, as she is called, is a "Prairie Witch", who serves as a bank vault where people store their memories in her body. After Black Sunday, these thoughts of memories, guilt, and American history, are sucked from her. From here, the plot of the story focuses on an orphaned, basketball playing teen, Dell, whose mother was murdered and the killer never found her Polish farmer uncle, Harp Oletsky, and a New Deal photographer. After the Antidote loses the good and bad memories of the people, they are confronted with their pasts and the town's dark secrets of its history of displacement of Native Americans.

The book is One Book, One Nebraska selection for 2026. All Nebraskans are encouraged to read it. Join us for discussion.

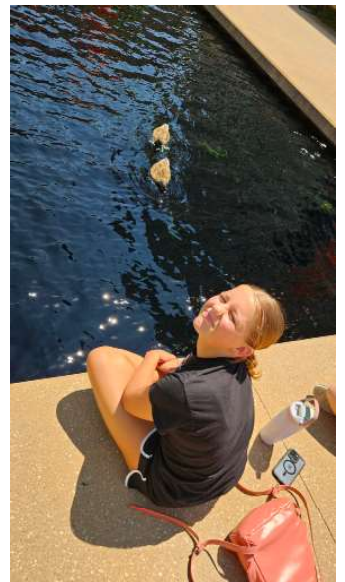
